# THE NEWS OF THE DAY – A Special Note from Fr Darien

Dear Friends,

*I call you friends*, Our Lord says in St John's Gospel, and I hope we are friends, though sometimes we may have different viewpoints.

We are bombarded by so much sad or bad news all the time. The news of this past week especially is hard to take in and digest.

For today, here is some good news!

This Sunday at our 9:00am Mass at Ocean Grove, we welcome with great joy our new Year Preps and their families from *Our Lady Star of the Sea Primary School.* 

With your blessing, at this same Mass, our Teachers, Staff and School Education Board members will pledge their commitment to the best possible education and the physical, mental and spiritual wellbeing of the young lives in their care. Dear Teachers and Leaders, you are an inspiration to us all and we celebrate you!

This coming week, *St Aloysius* and *Our Lady Star of the Sea* Schools will celebrate PANCAKE DAY. *Shrove Tuesday,* as it is also called, is the day when the custom for hundreds of years is to use up rich foods such as butter and eggs before we begin the fasting and simplifying of our lives in the coming weeks.

ASH WEDNESDAY introduces the holy season of LENT – a time when we are called to *turning around* or *conversion* of our hearts with prayer, reflection, charity, and review of our personal life. We are asked to examine our thoughts, words and actions to see the ways in which we may be negative, and how we may be more positive and LIFE-GIVING for ourselves, others and our world.

The thoughtful reflection by Fr Andrew Hamilton SJ which I've edited into our bulletin this week may help you find some perspective. As Fr Andy says, 'From the ash of bushfires, grass and plants spring green. Out of a scorched relationship, wisdom and compassion can grow. When we attend to the ashes of our lives and our world, we can recognise their causes and change our way of life.'

During Lent and Holy Week, Cathy Jenkins reminds us, 'we are offered beautiful and ancient tools to help us enter into

this time. These ... practices cultivate an environment in which we are able to think more deeply about God and about how we are responding to God's call in our daily lives.'

Finally, you may know the *Serenity Prayer*, originally written by Rev. Reinhold Niebuhr. A wonderful prayer – I commend it to you.

God, grant me the serenity To accept the things I cannot change, Courage to change the things I can, and Wisdom to know the difference.

*Living one day at a time, Enjoying one moment at a time, Accepting hardship as a pathway to peace,* 

*Taking, as Jesus did, This sinful world as it is, Not as I would have it, Trusting that You will make all things right, If I surrender to Your will, So that I may be reasonably happy in this life, And supremely happy with You forever in the next.*
