INTRODUCTION:

(Please begin by welcoming everyone to our Mass and introducing the Ministers of the Word, Ministers of Holy Communion, etc.)

Although our liturgy brings us nearer this week to the climax of Passiontide, our readings are full of hope and life.

In our **First Reading**, the people of Israel are exiled in Babylon. The prophet tells them that God will put a new spirit in them and raise them from their graves.

The **Psalm** is a prayer of trust in God, who is full of mercy and compassion. He will redeem Israel.

In the **Second Reading**, St Paul tells us that because we have received the Spirit of Christ, then 'he who raised Jesus from the dead will give life to your own mortal bodies.'

The **Gospel** unites all these themes of mercy and trust, of death and life, of redemption and resurrection, in the miracle of the raising of Lazarus from the dead. This great sign of Jesus being 'the resurrection and the life' leads us into the coming weeks.

As we contemplate these readings this week, may we draw closer to our Lord and accompany him as he sets his face towards Jerusalem.

As a Faith Community, let us take a moment to reflect in silence before we begin our Mass.

Reader: For a spirit of neighbourly love; may we not yield to fear and self-interest but choose to put ourselves at the service of others. (Pause for silent prayer) Let us pray to the Lord.

ALL: Lord, hear our prayer.

Reader: For the people of Malawi struggling with food insecurity and poverty; may our support for Project Compassion enable them to become more self-sufficient. (Pause for silent prayer) Let us pray to the Lord.

ALL: Lord, hear our prayer.

Reader: For our Parish community; may these last weeks of Lent draw us close together and ready to follow Jesus on the way of cross. (Pause for silent prayer) Let us pray to the Lord.

ALL: Lord, hear our prayer.

Reader: We pray for the recently deceased, including Lina (Pasqualina) Tacconelli, and for those whose anniversary of death occurs around this time: Margaret Nicholson, Jack Kean, Maud Curtis, Eileen Coughlan, Ricky Penning, Val Connor, Betty Deal, David Wood, Sybil Adams, Patrick Ker, Eileen Murphy; may they be called forth from the darkness of death into the light of life.
