

**We are saved by the power of love.**

In today's Gospel of St. Luke we find Jesus in prayer before conversing with the Apostles and revealing something important to them. In prayer Jesus understands his mission and explains it to the Apostles. So he asks them: "Who do you say I am?" And then he continues on explaining what he will have to go through to fulfil his mission. Peter gives the right answer: "You are the Christ of God" – the anointed, the Messiah! Jesus must have been visibly moved by this affirmation of Peter, but he felt he had to explain that his mission as Messiah was not what people and the Apostles themselves thought: glorious, powerful, coming in triumph. There will be no display of power in the mission of Jesus, but love, instead. In what way? He was destined to undergo much suffering, rejection, even be put to death as an impostor. All this because selfish (sinful) people would not stand a humble and obedient -to-God Messiah. They expected defeating power against the enemies. Jesus shows them, instead, the power of love, of humility, of obedience, of a new life built on truth and sincerity, leaving to God the time and way to defeat evil and building a kingdom of truth and love, justice and peace. In fact this came with his resurrection – the defeat of death, of evil, of arrogance. This way, the way of Jesus' fulfilling his messianic mission, caused him to suffer grievously and be, apparently, defeated in death. But the resurrection was his victory and proof of his immense love for us. He admonished the Apostles that this will also their way if they wanted to be faithful and fruitful in the mission entrusted to them. Luke in today's gospel put these words in the mouth of Jesus: "If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself, take up his cross daily and follow me". There is no painless Christianity just as there is no life without its harsh and brutal encounters with evil. The power of evil will never be won by the power of imposition or by humiliating the enemy, but instead by the power of love and forgiveness. Thus we understand the mission of Jesus and will be able to continue it: in prayer and love.



**Salvati dalla potenza dell'amore**

Il Vangelo di Luca oggi ci presenta Gesu' in preghiera prima di rivelare la sua missione agli apostoli e ammonirli che questa sua missione porterà rigetto, dolore e morte... prima della vittoria della risurrezione. Gesu' provoca gli apostoli domandando: "Voi, chi dite che io sia?" Pietro risponde: "Tu sei il Cristo di Dio" – l'Unto, il Messia. La risposta di Pietro e' giusta, ma forse Pietro aveva un'altra aspettativa del Messia: uno

che viene nella forza a sconfiggere i nemici e stabilire un nuovo regno per il popolo di Israele. Pazientemente Gesu' corregge questa visione e aspettativa del Messia e rivela un nuovo modo di salvare e trasformare la situazione umana: con la potenza dell'amore. La sua e' una missione di amore che si compie proprio quando dovra' soffrire il rigetto completo, gli insulti umilianti, una morte in croce come un impostore. Tutto questo Gesu' lo confronta con l'amore per obbedienza al Padre. La vittoria viene con la risurrezione: l'amore ha vinto il male.

Ai suoi apostoli dice: "Se qualcuno vuol venire dietro a me, rinneghi se' stesso, prenda la sua croce ogni giorno e mi segua". Prepotenza e forza sconfiggono i nemici, ma lasciano uno strascico di odio e volonta' di vendetta. La via di Cristo e' la via dell'amore e del perdono, nell'umilta' e nella verita':


questi hanno piu' forza di convinzione e di trasformazione.
