As you excel in everything-in faith, in utterance, in knowledge, in all earnestness, and in your love for us — see that you excel in this gracious work also. For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich. I do not mean that others should be eased and you burdened, but that as a matter of equality your abundance at the present time should supply their want, so that their abundance may supply your want, that there may be equality. As it is written, "He who gathered much had nothing over, and he who gathered little had no lack." *This is the Word of the Lord*

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St Mark (5:21-43) When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a great crowd gathered about him; and he was beside the sea. Then came one of the rulers of the synagogue, Jairus by name; and seeing him, he fell at his feet, and besought him, saying, "My little daughter is at the point of death. Come and lay your hands on her, so that she may be made well, and live." And he went with him. And a great crowd followed him and thronged about him. And there was a woman who had had a flow of blood for twelve years, and who had suffered much under many physicians, and had spent all that she had, and was no better but rather grew worse. She had heard the reports about Jesus, and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his garment. For she said, "If I touch even his garments, I shall be made well." And immediately the haemorrhage ceased; and she felt in her body that she was healed of her disease. And Jesus, perceiving in himself that power had gone forth from him, immediately turned about in the crowd, and said, "Who touched my garments?" And his disciples said to him, "You see the crowd pressing around you, and yet you say, 'Who touched me?'" And he looked around to see who had done it. But the woman, knowing what had been done to her, came in fear and trembling and fell down before him, and told him the whole truth. And he said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease." While he was still speaking, there came from the ruler's house some who said, "Your daughter is dead. Why trouble the teacher any further?" But ignoring what they said, Jesus said to the ruler of the synagogue, "Do not fear, only believe." And he allowed no one to follow him except Peter and James and John the brother of James. When they came to the house of the ruler of the synagogue, he saw a tumult, and people weeping and wailing loudly. And when he had entered, he said to them, "Why do you make a tumult and weep? The child is not dead but sleeping." And they laughed at him. But he put them all outside, and took the child's father and mother and those who were with him, and went in where the child was. Taking her by the hand he said to her, "Talitha cumi"; which means, "Little girl, I say to you, arise." And immediately the girl got up and walked; for she was twelve years old. And immediately they were overcome with amazement. And he strictly charged them that no one should know this, and told them to give her something to eat. Gospel of the Lord.

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We acknowledge the Wurundjeri people, the traditional owners and custodians of the land on which we stand. We pay our respects to them for their care of the land. May we walk gently on this land.



We don't know her name. She is an insignificant woman, lost in the midst of the crowd that follows Jesus. She doesn't dare speak with him as Jairus the synagogue leader did to get Jesus to go with him to his house. She could never be that lucky.

No one knows that she is a woman marked by a secret sickness. The teachers of the Law have taught her

to see herself as an «unclean» woman, as long as she has these flows of blood. Many years have passed, looking for a cure, but no one has been able to heal her. Where could she find the health that she needs in order to live with dignity?

Many people live among us with similar experiences. Humiliated by secret wounds that no one knows about, without energy to entrust their «sickness» to anyone, they look for help, peace and consolation without knowing where to find them. They feel guilty when most times they are just victims.

According to the Gospel story, the sick woman «hears about Jesus» and figures that she's in the presence of someone who can cast out the «impurity» of her body and of her whole life. Jesus doesn't talk about worthy or unworthy. His message speaks of love. His person radiates healing power.

The woman seeks her own path to meet up with Jesus. She doesn't feel herself able to face him: she will come close to him from behind. She's ashamed to speak to him of her sickness: she will act silently. She can't touch him physically: she'll just touch his cloak. That won't matter. That won't matter at all. In order to feel clean, it's enough to trust completely in Jesus.

He says the same. This woman doesn't need to be ashamed before anyone. What she has done isn't bad. It is an act of faith. Jesus has his way of curing secret wounds, and he says to those who seek him: «My daughter, my son, your faith has restored you to health. Go in peace and be free of vour complaint.»

Nessuno sa che è una donna segnata da un'infermità segreta. I maestri della Legge le hanno insegnato a

guardarsi come una donna «impura» finché abbia perdite di sangue. Ha passato molti anni cercando uno che la guarisse, ma nessuno è riuscito a risanarla. Dove potrà trovare la salute di cui ha bisogno per vivere con dignità?

Molte persone vivono tra noi esperienze simili. Umiliate da ferite nascoste che nessuno conosce, senza forze per confidare a qualcuno la loro «infermità», cercano aiuto, pace e consolazione senza sapere dove trovarle. Si sentono colpevoli quando spesso sono solo vittime.

Secondo il racconto, la donna inferma «sente parlare di Gesù» e intuisce di essere davanti a qualcuno che può togliere la «impurità» dal suo corpo e dalla sua intera vita. Gesù non parla di degnità o indegnità. Il suo messaggio parla di amore. La sua persona irradia forza guaritrice.

La donna cerca la sua propria via per trovarsi con Gesù. Non sente di avere la forza di guardarlo negli occhi; si avvicinerà da dietro. Ha vergogna di parlargli della sua infermità: agirà silenziosamente. Non può toccarlo fisicamente; gli toccherà solo il mantello. Non importa. Non importa nulla. Per sentirsi pulita basta questa fiducia grande in Gesù.

Lo dice lui stesso. Questa donna non deve vergognarsi davanti a nessuno. Quello che ha fatto non è cattivo. È un gesto di fede. Gesù ha le sue vie per guarire ferite nascoste, e dire a coloro che lo cercano: «Figlia, figlio, la tua fede ti ha guarito. Va in pace e risanato.»


