A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St Luke (10:1-12,17-20)

The Lord appointed seventy others, and sent them on ahead of him, two by two, into every town and place where he himself was about to come. And he said to them, “The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; pray therefore the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest. Go your way; behold, I send you out as lambs in the midst of wolves. Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and salute no one on the road. Whatever house you enter, first say, ‘Peace be to this house!’ And if a son of peace is there, your peace shall rest upon him; but if not, it shall return to you. And remain in the same house, eating and drinking what they provide, for the labourer deserves his wages; do not go from house to house. Whenever you enter a town and they receive you, eat what is set before you; heal the sick in it and say to them, ‘The kingdom of God has come near to you.’ But whenever you enter a town and they do not receive you, go into its streets and say, ‘Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet, we wipe off against you; nevertheless know this, that the kingdom of God has come near.’ I tell you, it shall be more tolerable on that day for Sodom than for that town.” The seventy returned with joy, saying, “Lord, even the demons are subject to us in your name!” And he said to them, “I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven. Behold, I have given you authority to tread upon serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy; and nothing shall hurt you. Nevertheless do not rejoice in this, that the spirits are subject to you; but rejoice that your names are written in heaven.” *The Gospel of the Lord.*

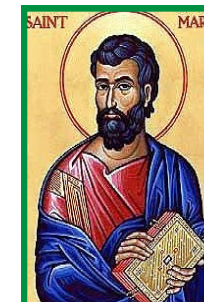

Sent to announce the Kingdom.

The Gospels on the last three Sundays speak, one after another, of being “called” and “sent”: the 12 apostles, the three whom Jesus had called, the 72 disciples. It is a trilogy that speaks of the same mission: Sent to announce the presence of God (His kingdom) that saves, heals and gives a new life. This is the “good news” (gospel) to bring to the world. Today the gospel says that Jesus sent 72 disciples and tells them: “The harvest is rich but the labourers are few”. It is easy to understand that this calling and sending are addressed to those close to the experience of Jesus. All are called to be “missionaries”. Today the same calling is addressed to those who maintain a close companionship with Jesus, as his disciples. The abundant harvest is made up of those who maintain a “sympathy” for Jesus – those baptized but absent from celebrating regularly their faith with the community; the people participating during special moments like Christmas, Easter, funeral, weddings, special Anniversary Masses, etc., but are normally busy with other preoccupations and commitments of everyday life. These have other priorities to attend. “Go!”, says the Lord Jesus to the disciples closer to him, “and announce the good things of the Kingdom of God to them”, speaking words of peace, healing, comforting. All of us are called to this mission, though difficult and uncomfortable. The good results will follow: “The 72 came back rejoicing saying: Lord, even the devils submit to us when we use your name”. This is the new missionary vocation of our time to a world that is waiting for a message of hope and encouragement and a healing presence. This is the essence of being a Catholic. The Second Vatican Council stated: “Each member of the Church is called to give witness to Jesus”. The invitation is to leave the Sunday celebration and, after having been with Christ and the brothers in the faith, to be persons of charity, hope, forgiveness, comfort towards the others, and thus manifest that to be with Jesus, listening to his words, sharing of his love in communion, these are in fact our strength, joy and truth in our life.



Mandati ad annunciare il Regno

Il Vangelo di queste tre domeniche parla in successione di “chiamata” e “mandati”: i 12 apostoli, i tre chiamati dal Signore Gesù, i 72 discepoli inviati. Una trilogia che parla di una stessa missione: Annunciare la presenza di Dio (il suo regno) che salva, guarisce, dona una vita nuova. Questa é la “buona notizia” (vangelo) da portare al mondo. Oggi il vangelo dice che Gesù inviò 72 discepoli dicendo: “Le messe é molta ma gli operai sono pochi”. É facile capire che 72 indica una chiamata e un invio di tutti coloro che si sono stretti attorno a Gesù. La parola di Dio oggi ci vuol dire che “missionari” dobbiamo essere tutti noi che teniamo stretta compagnia con Gesù, come suoi discepoli. La messe abbondante é anzitutto composta da coloro che mantengono una simpatia per Gesù – i battezzati, ma assenti regolarmente dalla comunità che celebra la fede; i fedeli d’occasione perché é Natale, Pasqua, un funerale, un matrimonio, una Messa anniversario di un defunto, ecc. - ma che spesso lo lasciano, distratti, per così dire, dalle preoccupazioni e impegni della vita. Altre priorità dominano nella loro vita! “Andate!” dice il Signore ai suoi discepoli piu’ fedeli, e annunciate loro i beni del Regno di Dio con l’annuncio di pace e la guarigione. Tutti siamo chiamati a questa missione, anche se difficile e scomoda. I beni si vedranno: “I 72 tornarono pieni di gioia dicendo: Signore, anche i demoni si sottomettono a noi nel tuo nome”. Questa é la nuova vocazione missionaria dei nostri tempi in un mondo che aspetta un annuncio di speranza e incoraggiamento e una presenza che risana. Questa missione é nella natura stessa di essere Cristiani. Il Concilio Vaticano II dice: “Ciascun membro della Chiesa deve rendere testimonianza a Gesù”. L’invito é di uscire dalla celebrazione domenicale, dopo essere stati con Gesù e i fratelli di fede, e essere persone di carità, di speranza, di perdono, di incoraggiamento, di conforto verso gli altri e così dimostrare che lo stare con Gesù, ascoltare la sua parola, partecipare del suo amore sono la nostra grande forza, gioia e verità di vita.

Today we unite in prayers for all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders. May they continue to enrich the Church in Australia so that it will be fully the Church that Jesus Christ wants her to be.
