

The Good Samaritan parable is well known and one of the richest in its content. We may ask if indeed this is a situation invented by Jesus for our teaching or a Jesus' reflection on a true event reported to him. The road from Jerusalem down to Jericho, about 40 km., was certainly difficult and thieves infested. A Jewish man was attacked, bitten-up, robed and left to die on the road. Several travellers passed by, took pity on him but gave no assistance. A Samari-
