A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St Matthew (13:24-43)
 Jesus put a parable before the crowd saying, "The Kingdom of heaven may be compared to a man who sowed good seed in his field; but while men were sleeping, his enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat, and went away. So when the plants came up and bore grain, then the weeds appeared also. And the servants of the householder came and said to him, 'Sir, did you not sow good seed in your field? How then has it weeds?' He said to them, 'An enemy has done this.' The servants said to him, 'Then do you want us to go and gather them?' But he said, 'No; lest in gathering the weeds you root up the wheat along with them. Let both grow together until the harvest; and at harvest time I will tell the reapers, Gather the weeds first and bind them in bundles to be burned, but gather the wheat into my barn.'" Another parable he put before them, saying, "The Kingdom of heaven is like a grain of mustard seed which a man took and sowed in his field; it is the smallest of all seeds, but when it has grown it is the greatest of shrubs and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches." He told them another parable. "The kingdom of heaven is like leaven which a woman took and hid in three measures of meal, till it was all leavened." All this Jesus said to the crowds in parables; indeed he said nothing to them without a parable. This was to fulfil what was spoken by the prophet: "I will open my mouth in parables, I will utter what has been hidden since the foundation of the world." Then he left the crowds and went into the house. And his disciples came to him saying, "Explain to us the parable of the weeds of the field." He answered, "He who sows the good seed is the Son of man; the field is the world, and the good seed means the sons of the kingdom; the weeds are the sons of the evil one, and the enemy who sowed them is the devil; the harvest is the close of the age, and the reapers are angels. Just as the weeds are gathered and burned with fire, so will it be at the close of the age. The Son of man will send his angels, and they will gather out of his kingdom all causes of sin and all evildoers, and throw them into the furnace of fire; there men will weep and gnash their teeth. Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their father. He who has ears, let him hear." **Gospel of the Lord.**

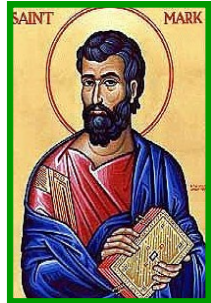

DIVINE PATIENCE: Life is mixture of good and evil. If we're honest, we see that there is both good and bad in us individually and collectively. Everywhere we look we find this strange mixture of what's right and what's wrong. In other words, in the field of our world there is the good wheat but also the reality of the weeds. As followers of Jesus Christ, what do we do with the problem of evil? That's the question raised in today's readings. Answering the question is a big problem for all of us. The Scripture passages in today's liturgy suggest that we deal with evil as God deals with it, with patience and forbearance. Evil will eventually reveal itself and evil will eventually suffer the consequences it brings down upon itself. Sin brings with it its own suffering and punishment. It is also a fact that so very often what is evil appears to be good, and what is good appears to be evil. We can't make the sorting; only God can. In today's parable Jesus speaks of the weeds are darnel. Now at the beginning of the growing process darnel looks just like wheat. It's only when harvest time approaches that the difference between the two becomes apparent. There are no "quick-fix" and easy solutions. Patience and forbearance are necessary, and to have patience and forbearance one must have faith. This is what Jesus is calling us to have: faith in His heavenly Father's plan, faith in His heavenly Father's ultimate ways of dealing with us and with our world. We have to believe in God's goodness and believe in His love for all that is good in our world. Reliance on God and acceptance of His ways is the only way we can overcome evil both in our world and in our lives. Isn't that the faith Jesus had when we suffered His agony and as He hung dying on the cross? The evil one tempted Him to go over to the dark side. But Jesus remained steadfast, confident that in the end, at harvest time, His Father in heaven would harvest the good wheat and burn the darnel. Dying, Jesus handed over His fate to His Father in heaven. Yes, it is a strange world we live in. But at the same time it is a beautiful world, a beautiful world filled with wonderful people. The great miracle is that goodness and love have always survived evil's attacks. Love is indeed victorious. Today, once again, Jesus invites us to share in His, vision, in His hope, and in His faith that in the end God will bring good out of evil. Even though it is difficult for us to understand the divine patience of our loving God, we are called to trust. At harvest time the righteous will shine like the sun.



LA PAZIENZA DIVINA:

E ognuno di noi, nonostante le grazie ricevute, resta inclinato al male: "Io non faccio il bene che voglio, dice san Paolo, ma il male che detesto". 2) Atteggiamento di pazienza. Talvolta siamo sorpresi, quasi scandalizzati, vedendo che Dio "lascia fare", e non colpisce immediatamente i fattori di disordini e di ingiustizie. Ma Dio non può rinnegare se stesso: la sua pazienza è il riflesso della sua infinita bontà. "Egli è lento nel punire, è pieno di bontà verso le sue creature". 3) Atteggiamento di fiducia. La pazienza che ci viene raccomandata, sull'esempio di quella di Dio, non è sterile rassegnazione, collera repressa o amara disperazione. Essa è un'attesa calma e serena. E' un fiore dell'anima che promette frutti saporiti. Deve passare l'inverno perché possa esplodere la primavera. Il tempo della pazienza è il tempo della gestazione. Dio trova sempre il mezzo di ordinare tutte le cose, anche il male, al trionfo del bene, alla vittoria dell'amore. Se bisogna odiare i vizi, bisogna farlo amando sempre le persone. Allora il piccolo seme perduto nel campo del mondo germoglierà e crescerà a poco a poco, fino a diventare l'albero immenso, fruscante di uccelli, del regno. Anche se è difficile capire la pazienza di Dio, dobbiamo avere fiducia in Lui. Sarà il Padre Eterno nel giudizio finale e nella sua sapienza chi raccoglierà i frutti buoni. Alla fine, i giusti splenderanno come il sole.
