



"Guard yourself against greed"

Today's scriptural readings are not about riches and material things to pursue but about the improper attitude toward wealth and material possessions which is called greed and avarice. The first reading points out the fact that material things and possessions do not \(\sqrt{} satisfy the human heart. In the gospel Jesus makes a statement which may not resonate well in a consumer-driven society where success and happiness are measured in terms of bank accounts and possessions. He says: Take care to guard yourself against greed, for though

one may be rich, one's value and happiness in life does not consist on possessions. Jesus calls the rich farmer "fool" in his plan to enlarge his barns and then enjoy life because he missed the point of his life and riches: be thankful to God and help those in need. "so you may have your reward in heaven". Material possessions are "vanity" if treated as an absolute and a priority in life. There is an old Spanish proverb which says: "There are no pockets in a shroud". The acts that we do to show our love for God and neighbour will be replaced by the Lord with the treasure of eternal life. Shopping with her mother one day, Jenny saw a necklace of glittering but cheap pearls and she begged her mother to buy it. She treasured it and often dressed up with them. Several evenings dad, in tucking her into bed, asked her if she would give it to him, to test her attachment to the necklace. She always refused saying how much she loved it. After a while, one night before going to bed, Jenny went to her father her lower lip trembling and tears in her eyes: "Here, Daddy, I want you to have it because I love you". She then opened her hands and gave him her loved necklace. With tears gathering in his own eyes, Daddy took the necklace. Then he reached into his pocket and took a small velvet case. Inside the case was a small, delicate necklace which he took and fastened it around his daughter's neck: it was of gold and with a real pearl. Dad had kept it all the time - he was just waiting for Jenny to give up the cheap one so he could give the her a genuine treasure.

darvi alla cupidigia delle cose perche' se anche uno e' ricco, la sua felicitá e valore della vita non dipende da ció che si possiede. Gesú chiama il ricco proprietario "stolto" nel suo progetto di ingrandire i granai e poi godersi la vita perche' non ha considerato' ció che e' piú importante per raggiungere la gioia e il valore dellla vita: dare gloria a Dio e aiutare i bisognosi. Le cose materiali sono "vanitá" se considerate cosí importanti da dare ad esse tutta la nostra attenzione. C'é un vecchio proverbio spagnolo che dice: "Non ci sono tasche nel lenzuolo mortuorio". Ció che facciamo per amore verso Dio e verso il prossimo sará premiato dal Signore con il tesoro della vita eterna. Un giorno, la figlia Jenny era con la mamma in un negozio quando la figlia vide una bella collana da pochi soldi con perle finte e pregó la mamma di comperargliela. Jenny la custodiva con gelosia e se la metteva al collo nelle occasioni piú belle. Il padre notó questo e volle vedere se la figlia fosse capace di staccarsene. Varie sere, nel metterla a letto, le chiese la collana per sé. Lei sempre si rifiutó tanto ne era gelosa. Ma dopo un certo tempo, una sera prima di andare a letto si presentó al papá con labra tremanti e gli occhi in lacrime: "Papá", disse, "ecco la collana che vuoi perché ti voglio tanto bene!". Fulfilling International Mission for Skilled Volunteers:




