

WHO DO YOU SAY THAT I AM?: In Today's Gospel Jesus asked two questions about his identity. One was about what people were saying about him and the other directed to his disciples: "who do you say that I am?" Many things have been said about Jesus in films, books, etc, as a revolutionary figure, a dreamer, the founder of a religion, etc. But the question from Jesus becomes very personal for us who claim to be his followers. It is not so much about the answers from others but first and foremost about my own profession of faith in Jesus Christ. In our daily living, there is the tendency to think about others

Egli è essenzialmente il Figlio di Dio, il Verbo fatto carne, il redentore del mondo. È poi significativo che Gesù voglia fondare la sua chiesa sulla fede di Pietro, che deve diventare la fede di tutti coloro che vogliono seguirlo sulla via della salvezza: «E io ti dico: Tu sei Pietro e su guesta pietra edificherò la mia chiesa e le porte degli inferi non prevarranno contro di essa». La roccia su cui poggia la chiesa e per cui sin dal suo nascere viene definita incrollabile è la fede in Cristo stesso, egli però l'affida al suo apostolo e ai successori.
