When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." Now Thomas, one of the twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see in his hands the print of the nails, and place my finger in the mark of the nails, and place my hand in his side, I will not believe." Eight days later, his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. The doors were shut, but Jesus came and stood among them, and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side; do not be faithless, but believing." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in his name.

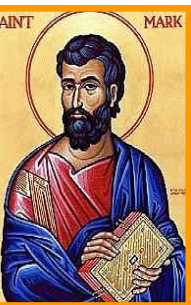

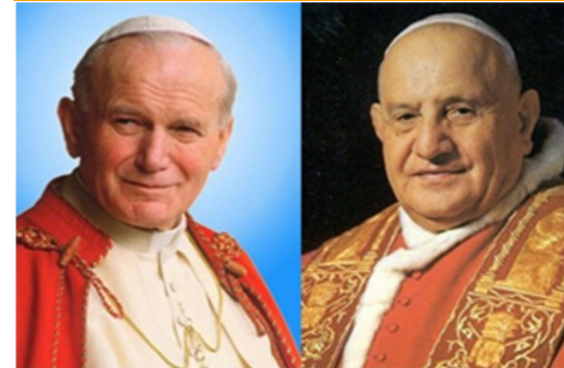

Two Popes, two Saints - Due Papi, due Santi

TWO popes raised to the altars on the same day! Two new saints declared whose lives we will celebrate in the liturgy and whose prayers we will invoke in our need. Pope St John XXIII and Pope St John Paul II are well known to us, not from history, but because their lives overlapped with ours. As popes of the modern era, their saintliness was known to all the world.

Angelo Roncalli was born in Italy in 1881 and, as Pope John XXIII, was Bishop of Rome for five years until his death in 1963. Karol Wojtyla was born in Poland in 1920 and, as Pope John Paul II, was Bishop of Rome from 1978 until his death on 2 April 2005. It is appropriate that both Pope John XXIII and Pope

John Paul II have their sainthood recognised on the same day because there are many similarities. Today John XXIII and John Paul II have been declared saints because recent generations of Catholics have recognised their heroic sanctity, deep love of the Church and its people, and tremendous service to humanity. By declaring their sainthood the Church honours their holiness, their human gifts, their great teaching, and their love for Jesus Christ and his people. Both St John XXIII and St John Paul II came from humble beginnings. Angelo Roncalli was the son of Italian peasants; Karol Wojtyla was the son of a simple Polish couple. The lives of both were shaped by war. During World War II, when Karol was studying for the priesthood in a clandestine seminary in Krakow, Archbishop Roncalli was Apostolic Delegate to Turkey and Greece in Istanbul. Because of the war, his time in this role lasted much longer than expected and he became familiar with the Muslim Turkish people. Both our new saints were also known for the great inspiration they gave to the young people of their day. A whole generation of young priests and religious took their inspiration from Pope John XXIII. Pope John Paul II will always be remembered as the founder of World Youth Day, and there is in the Church today a vibrant group of priests, religious, and laity known as the John Paul II generation. Finally, true sainthood is often reflected in the manner of the death of the saint. When Pope John XXIII died on 3 June 1963, the world recognised him as the pope who opened the windows of the Church to the Holy Spirit and as a brother and gifted member of the human family. In the final years before his death on 2 April 2005, Pope John Paul II gave a tremendously vibrant example of how to live as an elderly, suffering person. These two great saints are remarkable models of how each of us is called to live in Jesus Christ, to walk in holiness, to know the guidance of his truth, each in our own unique way. Today the Church rejoices at two new saints raised to the altars as wonderful examples of God's power in human hearts, which is an inspiration to our continued pilgrimage. **Pope St John XXIII, pray for us. Pope St John Paul II, pray for us.**

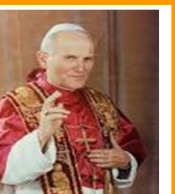
