

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: Cry out with joy to God, all the earth; O sing to the glory of his name. O render him glorious praise, alleluia. (Ps 65:1-2)

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles (2:14,22-33)

Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed the multitude, "Men of Israel, hear these words: Jesus of Nazareth, a man attested to you by God with mighty works and wonders and signs which God did through him in your midst, as you yourselves know—this Jesus, delivered up according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God, you crucified and killed by the hands of lawless men. But God raised him up, having loosed the pangs of death, because it was not possible for him to be held by it. For David says concerning him, 'I saw the Lord always before me, for he is at my right hand that I may not be shaken; therefore my heart was glad, and my tongue rejoiced; moreover my flesh will dwell in hope. For thou wilt not abandon my soul to Hades, nor let thy Holy One see corruption. Thou hast made known to me the ways of life; thou wilt make me full of gladness with thy presence'. "Brethren, I may say to you confidently of the patriarch David that he both died and was buried, and his tomb is with us to this day. Being therefore a prophet, and knowing that God had sworn with an oath to him that he would set one of his descendants upon his throne, he foresaw and spoke of the resurrection of the Christ, that he was not abandoned to Hades, nor did his flesh see corruption. This Jesus God raised up, and of that we all are witnesses." *This is the Word of the Lord.*

A reading from the First Letter of St Peter (1:17-21) If you invoke as Father him who judges each one impartially according to his deeds conduct yourselves with fear throughout the time of your exile. You know that you were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your fathers, not with perishable things such as silver or gold, but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot. He was destined before the foundation of the world but was made manifest at the end of the times for your sake. Through him you have confidence in God, who raised him from the dead and gave him glory, so that your faith and hope are in God. *This is the Word of the Lord.*

Alleluia, alleluia! Lord Jesus, open to us the scriptures. Make our hearts burn within us while you talk to us. **Alleluia**

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St Luke (24:13-35) On the first day of the week two disciples were going to a village named Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem, and talking with each other about all these things that had happened. While they were talking and discussing together, Jesus himself drew near and went with them. But their eyes were kept from recognizing him. And he said to them, "What is this conversation which you are holding with each other as you walk?" And they stood still, looking sad. Then one of them, named Cleopas, answered him, "Are you the only visitor to Jerusalem who does not know the things that have happened there in these days?" And he said to them, "What things?" And they said to him, "Concerning Jesus of Nazareth, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, and how our chief priests and rulers delivered him up to be condemned to death, and crucified him. But we had hoped that he was the one to redeem Israel. Yes, and besides all this, it is now the third day since this happened. Moreover, some women of our company amazed us. They were at the tomb early in the morning and did not find his body; and they came back saying that they had even seen a vision of angels, who said that he was alive. Some of those who were with us went to the tomb, and found it just as the women had said; but him they did not see." And he said to them, "O foolish men, and slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken! Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into his glory?" And beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them in all the scriptures the things concerning himself. So they drew near to the village to which they were going. He appeared to be going further, but they constrained him, saying, "Stay with us, for it is toward evening and the day is now far spent." So he went in to stay with them. When he was at table with them, he took the bread and blessed, and broke it, and gave it to them. And their eyes were opened and they recognized him; and he vanished out of their sight. They said to each other, "Did not our hearts burn within us while he talked to us on the road, while he opened to us the scriptures?" And they rose that same hour and returned to Jerusalem; and they found the eleven gathered together and those who were with them, who said, "The Lord has risen indeed, and has appeared to Simon!" Then they told what had happened on the road, and how he was known to them in the breaking of the bread.

THE ROAD TO EMMAUS: Emmaus is the symbol of my distance to faith. Emmaus is my house, when I am tempted to go back to my own little space, far away from the communion with others, closed, wounded, and selfish. It is symbol of losing faith in the salvific dream of Jesus. On the road to Emmaus Christ becomes my travelling companion. He becomes a migrant with me. His ardent presence little by little shortens my distance to regain faith. The Risen Lord is on the roads of this world, he walks with our own



pace through the dust of our roads, when our faith seems to fail. He changes our hearts, eyes and ways. The first miracle on the road to Emmaus is so sweet and subtle that we hardly notice it at the beginning. He enters into our lives without imposing. He explains the Scriptures and our heart begins to feel the ardour of love. It is the Word of God planted into our hearts and changing them. On the road to Emmaus, our view about life changes. Our longing for meaning and hope finds answers. The crucial attitude is the openness of heart: "stay with us, for it's nearly evening and the day is almost over". The answer to this invitation is God's hospitality breaking the bread and allowing us to recognize Him as Risen in my own life. The Words burning within us changes our hearts and the broken bread opens our eyes restoring our faith. The Word and the Bread together become the Eucharist that changes the way of every disciple. Nurtured by the Word and the Bread we return to Jerusalem, to our family in the faith, overcoming the darkness of the night with the sun shining within us. The challenge on this third Sunday of Easter is to break the Word and Bread with others. The road to Emmaus becomes the way to regain faith and to discover the Risen Lord in the Eucharist. Alleluia.

LA STRADA DI EMMAUS: Emmaus è il simbolo della mia distanza dalla fede. Emmaus è casa mia, quando sono tentato di tornare nel mio piccolo angolo, via dalla comunione con gli altri, chiuso, ferito ed egoista. È il simbolo della perdita di speranza nel sogno salvifico di Gesù. Nella strada di Emmaus Cristo si fa vicino. Lui diventa compagno di viaggio. Lui diventa migrante con me. La sua ardente presenza piano piano fa più corta la distanza verso la fede. Cristo Risorto è per le strade del mondo, rallenta i suoi passi al ritmo dei nostri,



dentro la polvere delle nostre strade, quando sulla mia fede scende la sera. Lui cambia il cuore, gli occhi e il cammino di ciascuno. Sulla strada di Emmaus il primo miracolo è così dolce da non accorgersene subito, così necessario da entrare senza imporsi: mentre lo sconosciuto spiega le Scritture, il «cuore lento» inizia a riempirsi di un calore nuovo. Che cosa fa ardere il cuore? La pienezza dell'amore. Parola che seminata nel cuore, lo cambia. Sulla strada di Emmanuel cambia la comprensione dell'intera vita. La nostra ricerca di significato e speranza trova delle risposte. Emerge così la grazia dell'accoglienza "Resta con noi, perché si fa sera". La risposta a questo invito è l'accoglienza di Dio rimanendo con noi, spezzando il pane permettendoci di riconoscere il Risorto nella mia vita. La parola ha cambiato il cuore, il pane cambia gli occhi ridonandoci il dono della fede. La parola e il pane insieme diventano l'Eucarestia che cambia il cammino di ogni discepolo. Nutriti con la Parola e il Pane ritorniamo a Gerusalemme, verso la mia famiglia nella fede, lasciando dietro il buio della notte con il sole dentro di me. La sifa di questa terza Domenica di Pasqua è spezzare anch'io il mio pane e la mia parola con gli altri nell'amore e nel servizio. La strada di Emmaus diventa il cammino che mi fa ritrovare la fede e che mi porta a vedere il Risorto nella Eucarestia. Alleluia.
