### ARCHBISHOP'S MESSAGE FOR LENT 2017

This Lent 2017 I pray and that your Lenten spiritual gifts. I recommend we all make some simple commitments. May all of us here in the Archdiocese of Melbourne: pray, fast and give alms.

**Prayer**: strengthens our relationship with Christ. One simple suggestion is to spend an extra fifteen minutes at night slowly reading, praying and reflecting on the daily Gospel. It isn't a great sacrifice but it really helps

Another simple practice is for each of us to seek forgiveness in the Sacrament of Penance. I encourage you all to make a good confession before Easter, even if it has been a long time. In the early Church, they called confession the 'second conversion in tears.' Saint Peter wept in sorrow after denying Jesus, and in his mercy Christ spoke to him the tender words of his pardon and peace. In the sacrament, we too can hear these words of

**Fasting:** we 'give up' food, drink or whatever. Let us never forget it isn't all about what we do as individual. Self-denial frees our mind and our resources. It should readily redirect our attention from ourselves toward others. What money or time we do not spend on ourselves, we need to spend for the benefit of others.

Almsgiving: it is the heart of the issue. Pope Francis constantly emphasises this connection between self-denial and charitable outreach. Lent rescues us from ourselves and frees us to think about others - particularly those who suffer from poverty. Supporting the wonderful work of Caritas by contributing to Project Compassion is one great way. Another small act of 'almsgiving' could be giving people some of our valuable 'time'. Pope Francis says: "The other person is a gift; urging us to welcome and

love life, especially when it is weak and vulnerable": the sick or elderly in your parish, welcome the 'stranger, the refugees in your area. May we never forget to ask ourselves: "How can I share with my neighbours in need?" + Denis J. Hart,

Liberandoci dall'ingordigia, liberiamo risorse per aiutare e per dare la nostra attenzione agli altri. Cio' che non spendiamo per noi stessi lo diamo in carita' ai bisognosi.

Assistenza: sta' al cuore della Quaresima. Il Papa Francesco spesso ci richiama al nesso tra rinuncia e assistenza. La pratica quaresimale ci libera dall'egoismo e soddisfazione personale e ci porta ad attendere ai bisogni degli altri – specialmente di chi soffre la poverta'.
