And the Lord said to me, 'They have rightly said all that they have spoken. I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their brethren; and I will put my words in his mouth, and he shall speak to them all that I command him. And whoever will not give heed to my words which he shall speak in my name, I myself will require it of him. But the prophet who presumes to speak a word in my name which I have not commanded him to speak, or who speaks in the name of other gods, that same prophet shall die.'"
This is the Word of the Lord.

A reading from the First Letter of St Paul to the Corinthians (7:32-35)
I want you to be free from anxieties. The unmarried man is anxious about the affairs of the Lord, how to please the Lord; but the married man is anxious about worldly affairs, how to please his wife, and his interests are divided. And the unmarried woman or girl is anxious about the affairs of the Lord, how to be holy in body and spirit; but the married woman is anxious about worldly affairs, how to please her husband. I say this for your own benefit, not to lay any restraint upon you, but to promote good order and to secure your undivided devotion to the Lord.
This is the Word of the Lord.

Alleluia, alleluia! Blessed are you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, for revealing the mysteries of the kingdom to mere children. **Alleluia!** (Mt 11:25).

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St Mark (1:21-28)
They went into Capernaum; and immediately on the sabbath Jesus entered the synagogue and taught. And they were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one who had authority, and not as the scribes. And immediately there was in their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit; and he cried out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are, the Holy One of God." But Jesus rebuked him saying, "Be silent, and come out of him!" And the unclean spirit, convulsing him and crying with a loud voice, came out of him. And they were all amazed, so that they questioned among themselves, saying, "What is this? A new teaching! With authority he commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey him." And at once his fame spread everywhere throughout all the surrounding region of Galilee. **The Gospel of the Lord.**



A DAY IN THE LIFE OF JESUS:

St Mark at the beginning of his Gospel presents a normal day in the life of Jesus. The evangelist wants us to see the ministry of Jesus in its different aspects: the preaching in the temple, the healing of the sick, the consoling words given to the suffering, the expulsion of unclean spirits like in today's Gospel reading. There is time for everyone: a word, a kind gesture, a healing action, a comforting presence. Jesus has even time to pray from where He finds the strength to love and carry on his mission. Looking at Jesus' activities in one day we are called to see how we use our time. Time is precious and it is to be used wisely producing many fruits. There is the saying: "Laziness is the mother of all vices". For us Christians not using well the gift of time is also the refuse of a gift. As life gives time is indeed a gift to be used to give life becoming contemplative in actions. As described by the evangelists, a day in the life of Jesus is full of good deeds. As we begin the second month of 2015, a good resolution could be to use well our time in spreading God's kingdom. Let us not be consumed by time but let us consume well our time in making a difference in the world with the joy of the Gospel.


