

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles(2:1-11)

When the day of the Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly a sound came from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them tongues as of fire, distributed and resting on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance. Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. And they were amazed and wondered, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians, we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God."

Pentecost Sunday Sequence

Thou, on us who evermore thee confess and thee adore, with thy sevenfold gifts descend: Give us comfort when we die; give us life with thee on high; give us joys that never end.

A reading from the First Letter of St Paul to the Corinthians (12:3b-7,12-13)

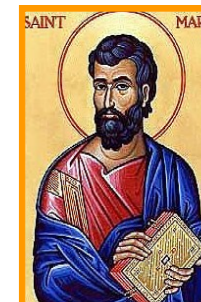
No one can say "Jesus is Lord" except by the Holy Spirit. Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of working, but it is the same God who inspires them all in every one. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body – Jews or Greeks, slaves or free – and all were made to drink of one Spirit. **This is the Word of the Lord.**

Alleluia, alleluia! Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful, and kindle in them the fire of your love. **Alleluia!**

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St John (20:19-23)

On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being shut where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." **The Gospel of the Lord.**

FROM A GREAT POWER THERE IS ALSO A GREAT RESPONSIBILITY:

Today is the feast of the Holy Spirit who is Lord and gives life. It is clear from the Gospel that the Spirit is a gift from the Risen Lord who "breathed on them and said to them: receive the Holy Spirit". These words ring a bell and bring us to the first pages of the Bible when "God shaped man from the soil of the ground and blew the breath of life into his nostrils, and man became a living being". The breath of God gives us life and makes us new creatures. The Pentecost, therefore, is a new creation. As we celebrate Pentecost we are called to welcome the life of God in our hearts, the gifts and the fruits of the Holy Spirit. We are called to receive life by opening our hearts to the gift of the Spirit and called to give life by loving as Jesus loved us. Pentecost is the feast of the Church that has received the Holy Spirit and has been sent to bring life. Pentecost is the birthday of the Church and we celebrate the power of the Spirit present in the Christian community. This solemnity gives us the opportunity to renew of love for the Church and also to affirm our sense of belonging to our Christian community celebrating our communion in diversity. In the Church all members count and are to be respected in their own charisms. The feast of the Pentecost calls us to have the courage to proclaim the Gospel and the true meaning of ecclesial communion based on the power of God's love. This is clearly said by St Paul in the second reading: "as the body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves of free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit". Today we are reminded that we have received a great power and therefore we also have a great responsibility: to be agents of peace, reconciliation, forgiveness, communion, bearers of the life we have received. Let us joyfully celebrate the birthday of our mother Church and renew of willingness to bring life to one another with the power of God's love in our hearts. Let us speak and practice the language of love which is the source of unity.



DA UN GRANDE POTERE UNA GRANDE RESPONSABILITÀ:

Sono le stesse parole: Gesù soffia su di noi lo Spirito e diventiamo creature nuove. La Pentecoste è dunque una nuova creazione. Gesù ci ha rigenerati sulla Croce e nella Pentecoste soffia su di noi la vita nuova. Lo Spirito effonde sulla terra i suoi doni. Primo dono è l'amore, poi la sapienza, l'intelletto, il consiglio, la fortezza, la scienza, la pietà, il timor di Dio. I frutti dello Spirito sono: amore, gioia, pace, pazienza, benevolenza, bontà, mitezza, dominio di sé. La Pentecoste è la festa della Chiesa, che ha ricevuto lo Spirito Santo ed è mandata a compiere la missione della salvezza. E' in questa Chiesa che siamo chiamati a fare la nostra parte. Siamo chiamati a costruire e servire l'unità della Chiesa: essa è un solo Corpo che è Cristo, perché uno solo è il Signore, uno lo Spirito, uno è il battesimo. Signore, uno lo Spirito, uno è il battesimo. La missione della Chiesa è riconciliare il mondo con Dio e i frutti di questa riconciliazione sono la pace e l'unità. Dove c'è la pace e l'unità c'è lo Spirito Santo; dove c'è discordia, non c'è lo Spirito. Le folle a Gerusalemme parlavano tante lingue eppure capiscono la lingua degli apostoli perché è la lingua dell'amore; si crea l'unità nello Spirito e Lui fa capire: c'è una lingua di amore, di pace e unità, di perdono, di riconciliazione. La Pentecoste ci ricorda che "Da un grande potere, derivano grandi responsabilità". Gli Apostoli sono investiti di un grande potere dall'Alto, da Dio. E' il dono dello Spirito Santo che l'evangelista Giovanni racconta mostrandoci Gesù Risorto stesso che "soffia" sugli apostoli il dono dello Spirito. Con questo dono dello Spirito Santo, si chiude il cerchio degli eventi pasquali: nasce la Chiesa, la comunità dei discepoli di Gesù, che hanno il compito di portare la sua parola in ogni luogo e in ogni tempo. Meditare questi passi della Scrittura che raccontano la nascita della Chiesa, significa anche ricordarci quale è la nostra identità di Chiesa oggi, e ricordarci quale è lo stile che ci caratterizza. Abbiamo ricevuto un potere grande dall'alto, un potere che non ci permette però di sentirci potenti e padroni, ma al contrario ci mette davanti le nostre grandi responsabilità.

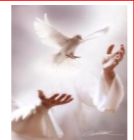
