## A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St Matthew (3:1-12)

The voice of one crying in the wilderness: Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight." Now John wore a garment of camel's hair, and a leather girdle around his waist; and his food was locusts and wild honey. Then went out to him Jerusalem and all Judea and all the region about the Jordan, and they were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. But when he saw many of the Pharisees and the Sadducees coming for Baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruit that befits repentance. and do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father'; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. THE CATHOLIC FAITH (Serialised presentation from: Compendium of the Catechism)
PART ONE

CHAPTER TWO: <u>God Comes to Meet Man</u>
The Revelation of God

6. What does God reveal to man? (50-53; 68-69) God in his goodness and wisdom reveals himself. With deeds and words, he reveals himself and his plan of loving goodness which he decreed from all eternity in Christ. According to this plan, all people by the grace of the Holy Spirit are to share in the divine life as adopted "sons" in the only begotten Son of God.

7. What are the first stages of God's Revelation? (54-58; 70-71) From the very beginning, God manifested himself to our first parents, Adam and Eve, and invited them to intimate communion with himself.

After their fall, he did not cease his revelation to them but promised salvation for all their descendants. After the flood, he made a covenant with Noah, a covenant between himself and all living beings.

8. What are the next stages of God's Revelation? (59-64; 72) God chose Abram, calling him out of his country, making him "the father of a multitude of nations" (*Genesis* 17:5), and promising to bless in him "all the nations of the earth" (*Genesis* 12:3). The people descended from Abraham would be the trustee of the divine promise made to the patriarchs. God formed Israel as his chosen people, freeing them from slavery in Egypt, establishing with them the covenant of Mount Sinai, and, through Moses, giving them his law. The prophets proclaimed a radical redemption of the people and a salvation which would include all nations in a new and everlasting covenant. From the people of Israel and from the house of King David, would be born the Messiah, Jesus.

9. What is the full and definitive stage of God's Revelation? (65-66; 73) The full and definitive stage of God's revelation is accomplished in his Word made flesh, Jesus Christ, the mediator and fullness of Revelation. He, being the only-begotten Son of God made man, is the perfect and definitive Word of the Father. In the sending of the Son and the gift of the Spirit, Revelation is now fully complete, although the faith of the Church must gradually grasp its full significance over the course of centuries. "In giving us his Son, his only and definitive Word, God spoke everything to us at once in this sole Word, and he has no more to say." (Saint John of the Cross)

10. What is the value of private revelations? (67) While not belonging to the deposit of faith, private revelations may help a person to live the faith as long as they lead us to Christ. The Magisterium of the Church, which has the duty of evaluating such private revelations, cannot accept those which claim to surpass or correct that definitive Revelation which is Christ.

CAPITOLO SECONDO: <u>DIO VIENE INCONTRO</u> ALL'UOMO - *LA RIVELAZIONE DI DIO* 

6. Che cosa Dio rivela all'uomo? (50-53; 68-69) Dio, nella sua bontà e sapienza, si rivela all'uomo. Con eventi e parole rivela Se stesso e il suo disegno di benevolenza, che ha prestabilito dall'eternità in Cristo a favore dell'umanità. Tale disegno consiste nel far partecipare, per la grazia dello Spirito Santo, tutti gli uomini alla vita divina, quali suoi figli adottivi nel suo unico Figlio.

7. Quali sono le prime tappe della Rivelazione di Dio? (54-58; 70-71) Dio, fin dal principio, si manifesta ai progenitori, Adamo ed Eva, e li invita ad un'intima comunione con lui. Dopo la loro caduta, non interrompe la sua rivelazione e

promette la salvezza per tutta la loro discendenza. Dopo il diluvio, stipula con Noè un'alleanza tra lui e tutti gli esseri viventi.

- 8. Quali sono le tappe successive della Rivelazione di Dio? (59-64; 72) Dio sceglie Abram chiamandolo fuori del suo Paese per fare di lui «il padre di una moltitudine di popoli» (Gn 17,5), e promettendogli di benedire in lui «tutte le Nazioni della terra» (Gn 12,3). I discendenti di Abramo saranno i depositari delle promesse divine fatte ai patriarchi. Dio forma Israele come suo popolo di elezione, salvando lo dalla schiavitù dell'Egitto, conclude con lui l'Alleanza del Sinai e, per mezzo di Mosè, gli dà la sua Legge. I Profeti annunziano una radicale redenzione del popolo e una salvezza che includerà tutte le Nazioni in una Alleanza nuova ed eterna. Dal popolo d'Israele, dalla stirpe del re Davide nascerà il Messia: Gesù.
- 9. Qual è la tappa piena e definitiva della Rivelazione di Dio? (65-66; 73) È quella attuata nel suo Verbo incarnato, Gesù Cristo, mediatore e pienezza della Rivelazione. Egli, essendo l'Unigenito Figlio di Dio fatto uomo, è la Parola perfetta e definitiva del Padre. Con l'invio del Figlio e il dono dello Spirito la Rivelazione è ormai pienamente compiuta, anche se nel corso dei secoli la fede della Chiesa dovrà coglierne gradualmente tutta la portata. «Dal momento in cui ci ha donato il Figlio suo, che è la sua unica e definitiva Parola, Dio ci ha detto tutto in una sola volta in questa Sua Parola e non ha più nulla da dire» (san Giovanni della Croce).
- 10. Quale valore hanno le rivelazioni private? (67) Pur non appartenendo al deposito della fede, esse possono aiutare a vivere la stessa fede, purché mantengano il loro stretto orientamento a Cristo. Il Magistero della Chiesa, cui spetta il discernimento di tali rivelazioni private, non può pertanto accettare quelle che pretendono di superare o correggere la Rivelazione definitiva che è Cristo.
