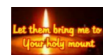

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St Luke (10:1-12,17-20)
 The Lord appointed seventy others, and sent them on ahead of him, two by two, into every town and place where he himself was about to come. And he said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; pray therefore the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest. Go your way; behold, I send you out as lambs in the midst of wolves. Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and salute no one on the road. Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace be to this house!' And if a son of peace is there, your peace shall rest upon him; but if not, it shall return to you. And remain in the same house, eating and drinking what they provide, for the labourer deserves his wages; do not go from house to house. 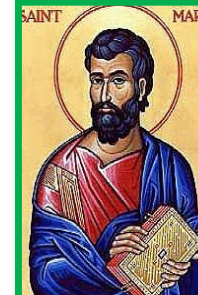

FREEDON, RESPONSIBILITY AND THE MORAL LIFE

363. What is freedom? (1730-1733; 1743-1744) Freedom is the power given by God to act or not to act, to do this or to do that, and so to perform deliberate actions on one's own responsibility. Freedom characterizes properly human acts. The more one does what is good, the freer one becomes. Freedom attains its proper perfection when it is directed toward God, the highest good and our beatitude. Freedom implies also the possibility of choosing between good and evil. The choice of evil is an abuse of freedom and leads to the slavery of sin.

364. What is the relationship between freedom and responsibility? (1734-1737; 1745-1746) Freedom makes people responsible for their actions to the extent that they are voluntary, even if the imputability and responsibility for an action can be diminished or sometimes cancelled by ignorance, inadvertence, duress, fear, inordinate attachments, or habit.

365. Why does everyone have a right to exercise freedom? (1738; 1747) The right to the exercise of freedom belongs to everyone because it is inseparable from his or her dignity as a human person. Therefore this right must always be respected, especially in moral and religious matters, and it must be recognized and protected by civil authority within the limits of the common good and a just public order.

366. What place does human freedom have in the plan of salvation? (1739-1742; 1748) Our freedom is weakened because of original sin. This weakness is intensified because of successive sins. Christ, however, set us free "so that we should remain free" (Galatians 5:1). With his grace, the Holy Spirit leads us to spiritual freedom to make us free co-workers with him in the Church and in the world.

367. What are the sources of the morality of human acts? (1749-1754; 1757-1758) The morality of human acts depends on three sources: *the object chosen*, either a true or apparent good; *the intention of the subject who acts*, that is, the purpose for which the subject performs the act; and *the circumstances of the act*, which include its consequences.



LA LIBERTÀ, RESPONSABILITÀ E VITA MORALE

363. Che cos'è la libertà? (1730-1733; 1743-1744) È il potere donato da Dio all'uomo di agire o di non agire, di fare questo o quello, di porre così da se stesso azioni deliberate. La libertà caratterizza gli atti propriamente umani. Quanto più si fa il bene, tanto più si diventa liberi. La libertà raggiunge la propria perfezione quando è ordinata a Dio, sommo Bene e nostra Beatitudine. La libertà implica anche la possibilità di scegliere tra il bene e il male. La scelta del male è un abuso della libertà, che conduce alla schiavitù del peccato.

364. Quale relazione esiste tra libertà e responsabilità? (1734-1737; 1745-1746) La libertà rende l'uomo responsabile dei suoi atti nella misura in cui sono volontari, anche se l'imputabilità e la responsabilità di un'azione possono essere sminuite e talvolta annullate

dall'ignoranza, dall'inavvertenza, dalla violenza subita, dal timore, dagli affetti smodati, dalle abitudini.

365. Perché ogni uomo ha diritto all'esercizio della libertà? (1738; 1747) Il diritto all'esercizio della libertà è proprio d'ogni uomo, in quanto è inseparabile dalla sua dignità di persona umana. Pertanto tale diritto va sempre rispettato, particolarmente in campo morale e religioso, e deve essere civilmente riconosciuto e tutelato nei limiti del bene comune e del giusto ordine pubblico.

366. Come si colloca la libertà umana nell'ordine della salvezza? (1739-1742; 1748) La nostra libertà è indebolita a causa del primo peccato. L'indebolimento è reso più acuto dai peccati successivi. Ma Cristo «ci ha liberati perché restassimo liberi» (Gal 5, 1). Con la sua grazia lo Spirito Santo ci conduce alla libertà spirituale, per farci suoi liberi collaboratori nella Chiesa e nel mondo.

367. Quali sono le fonti della moralità degli atti umani? (1749-1754; 1757-1758) La moralità degli atti umani dipende da tre fonti: *dall'oggetto scelto*, ossia un bene vero o apparente; *dall'intenzione del soggetto che agisce*, e cioè dal fine per cui egli compie l'azione; *dalle circostanze dell'azione*, ivi comprese le conseguenze.







The parish has been in discussion with these groups since before 2009 and we have always strongly rejected the proposal of the removal, we think with a considered adjustment to their plans the "Keep Clear" could and should stay.
