





A reading from the book of Kings (3:5, 7-12)

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Homily notes:

THE FUTURE “Again, the kingdom of heaven is like...”

The parables address a central feature concerning the kingdom of God (for Matthew 'kingdom of heaven'). The kingdom is essentially future; it is not yet something one can 'possess'. People who really catch a glimpse of it from Jesus’ preaching know they have come on a treasure that will fulfil lifelong desires and aspirations. He cannot yet 'deliver' it to them or place them within it but the glimpse of it that he communicates fills them with such joy that they have the freedom to 'sell all' in order, one day, to gain it. The parables are essentially descriptive. They are not about what one 'ought' to do; they simply describe what happens in the life of people who have caught a glimpse of the kingdom. While not yet within their grasp, it is already bringing joy, freedom, and hope to human lives. The outstanding historical example of such transformation would be St Francis of Assisi. His commitment to radical poverty did not come to him as a hard moral demand. It flowed in complete freedom from the 'treasure' of divine love that he had come upon in such high degree.

ESSENCE OF CHRISTIAN SPIRITUALITY
The two brief parables encapsulate the essence of Christian spirituality. Christian life requires a measure of detachment. It requires freedom from being completely absorbed and immersed in the attractions, pleasures, and concerns of these world – not because these are bad in themselves but because we have been 'captured' by a sense of God’s love and God’s future for us that relativises all these things and puts them in their place. We do not yet possess the treasure but the prospect of it, unseen but grasped in faith, is already working transformation.

Riflessione:
XVII DOMENICA DEL TEMPO ORDINARIO (ANNO A)

San Tommaso d’Aquino, il grande teologo del Medioevo, utilizza un’immagine: noi uomini siamo come una freccia già in piena corsa. Un altro ha preso la mira e ha tirato. Non spetta più a noi cercare un obiettivo: è già stabilito. E dove va questa freccia di cui il Creatore ha stabilito l’obiettivo? Ecco la risposta: la freccia corre verso il bene, e dunque verso la felicità. Dio, e la felicità di essere presso di lui, corrispondono alla più profonda aspirazione dell’uomo. Qui non vi è nulla di imposto, nessun compito da fare come penso, nessun passaggio a gincana, non dobbiamo stringere i denti. Come il ruscello scorre naturalmente verso il mare, così l’uomo è in cammino verso Dio. Questo insegnamento sugli uomini si trova nella parabola di Gesù che ci presenta il Vangelo. È riassunto in sette righe di una semplicità geniale. Il Regno dei cieli è proprio ciò che si cerca nel profondo del cuore. È come un tesoro di cui si scopre l’esistenza. È come una perla, la perla delle perle che il mercante ha cercato per tutta la sua vita. Se il mercante raggiunge il suo obiettivo, non è grazie alla sua tenacia, ma perché ciò gli è concesso in dono. Tuttavia il regno dei cieli non ci è tirato in testa. Bisogna impegnarsi personalmente, essere pronti anche a sacrificare tutto. Ma non per una cosa estranea. È ciò che abbiamo di più personale, e al tempo stesso un dono. E bisogna saper cogliere questo dono; bisogna essere pronti. Quando si raggiunge l’obiettivo, non bisogna crollare come dopo un eccesso di sforzo, ma esultare di indescrivibile gioia. Il segreto del cristianesimo può essere espresso in un’immagine di sette righe. Ce ne vogliono un po’ di più ai predicatori! Quanto a ciascuno di noi, ci vuole tutta una vita per capirlo.
