A reading from the Letter of St Paul to the Colossians (3:1-5,9-11)

If you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. For you have died, and your life is hid with Christ in God. When Christ who is our life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory. Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old nature with its practices and have put on the new nature, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator. Here there cannot be Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free man, but Christ is all, and in all. *This is the Word of the Lord.*

And he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns, and build larger ones; and there I will store all my grain and my goods. And I will say to my soul, 'Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; take your ease, eat, drink, be merry.' But God said to him, 'Fool! This night your soul is required of you; and the things you have prepared, whose will they be?' So is he who lays up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God." *The Gospel of the Lord.*



THE VIRTUES

377. What is a virtue? (1803; 1833) A virtue is an habitual and firm disposition to do the good. "The goal of a virtuous life is to become like God" (Saint Gregory of Nyssa). There are human virtues and theological virtues.



378. What are the human virtues? (1804; 1810-1811; 1834; 1839) The human virtues are habitual and stable perfections of the intellect and will that govern our actions, order our passions and guide our conduct according to reason and faith. They are acquired and strengthened by the repetition of morally good acts and they are purified and elevated by divine grace.

379. What are the principal human virtues? (1805; 1834) The principal human virtues are called the cardinal virtues, under which all the other virtues are grouped and which are the hinges of a virtuous life. The cardinal virtues are: prudence, justice, fortitude, and temperance.

380. What is prudence? (1806; 1835) Prudence disposes reason to discern in every circumstance our true good and to choose the right means for achieving it. Prudence guides the other virtues by pointing out their rule and measure.

381. What is justice? (1807; 1836) Justice consists in the firm and constant will to give to others their due. Justice toward God is called "the virtue of religion."

382. What is fortitude? (1808; 1837) Fortitude assures firmness in difficulties and constancy in the pursuit of the good. It reaches even to the ability of possibly sacrificing one's own life for a just cause.

383. What is temperance? (1809; 1838) Temperance moderates the attraction of pleasures, assures the mastery of the will over instincts and provides balance in the use of created goods.

384. What are the theological virtues? (1812-1813; 1840-1841) The theological virtues have God himself as their origin, motive and direct object. Infused with sanctifying grace, they bestow on one the capacity to live in a relationship with the Trinity. They are the foundation and the energizing force of the Christian's moral activity and they give life to the human virtues. They are the pledge of the presence and action of the Holy Spirit in the faculties of the human being.

LE VIRTÙ'

377. Che cos'è la virtù? (1803,1833) La virtù è una disposizione abituale e ferma a fare il bene. «Il fine di una vita virtuosa consiste nel divenire simile a Dio» (san Gregorio di Nissa). Vi sono virtù umane e virtù teologali.

378. Che cosa sono le virtù umane? (1804; 1810-1811; 1834,1839) Le virtù umane sono perfezioni abituali e stabili dell'intelligenza e della volontà, che regolano i nostri atti, ordinano le nostre passioni e indirizzano la nostra condotta in conformità alla ragione e alla fede. Acquisite e rafforzate per mezzo di atti moralmente buoni e ripetuti, sono purificate ed elevate dalla grazia divina.

379. Quali sono le virtù umane principali? (1805; 1834) Sono le virtù denominate cardinali, che raggruppano tutte le altre e che costituiscono i cardini della vita virtuosa. Esse sono: prudenza, giustizia, forza e temperanza.

380. Che cos'è la prudenza? (1806; 1835) La prudenza dispone la ragione a discernere, in ogni circostanza, il nostro vero bene e a scegliere i mezzi adeguati per attuarlo. Essa guida le altre virtù, indicando loro regola e misura.

381. Che cos'è la giustizia? (1807; 1836) La giustizia consiste nella volontà costante e ferma di dare agli altri ciò che è loro dovuto. La giustizia verso Dio è chiamata «virtù della religione».

382. Che cos'è la forza? (1808; 1837) La forza assicura la fermezza nelle difficoltà e la costanza nella ricerca del bene, giungendo fino alla capacità dell'eventuale sacrificio della propria vita per una giusta causa.

383. Che cos'è la temperanza? (1809; 1838) La temperanza modera l'attrattiva dei piaceri, assicura il dominio della volontà sugli istinti e rende capaci di equilibrio nell'uso dei beni creati.

384. Che cosa sono le virtù teologali? (1812-1813; 1840-1841) Sono le virtù che hanno come origine, motivo e oggetto immediato Dio stesso. Infuse nell'uomo con la grazia santificante, esse rendono capaci di vivere in relazione con la Trinità e fondano e animano l'agire morale del cristiano, vivificando le virtù umane. Sono il pegno della presenza e dell'azione dello Spirito Santo nelle facoltà dell'essere umano.
