He shall judge between the nations, and shall decide for many peoples; and they shall beat their swords into ploughshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more. O house of Jacob, come let us walk in the light of the Lord. This is the Word of the Lord.

Responsorial Psalm:

Response: Let us go rejoicing to the house, to the house of the Lord.

I rejoiced when I heard them say: "Let us go to God's house." And now our feet are standing within your gates, O Jerusalem. **R**./

It is there that the tribes go up, the tribes of the Lord. For Israel's law it is, there were set the thrones of Judgement of the house of David. **R**/

A reading from the First Letter of St Paul to the Romans (13:11-14) Brethren: You know what hour it is, how it is full time now for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed; the night is far gone, the day is at hand. Let us then cast off the works of darkness, and put on the armour of light; let us conduct ourselves becomingly as in the day, not in revelling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarrelling and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh to gratify its desires. *This is the Word of the Lord.*

Alleluia, alleluia! Let us see, O Lord, your mercy and give us your saving help. Alleluia! (Ps 84:8)

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St Matthew (24:37-44 Jesus said to his disciples: "As were the days of Noah, so will be the coming of the Son of man. For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day when Noah entered the ark, and they did not know until the flood came and swept them all away, so will be the coming of the Son of man. Then two men will be in the field; one is taken and one is left. Two women will be grinding at the mill; one is taken and one is left. Watch therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. But know this, that if the householder had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have watched and would not have let his house be broken into. Therefore you also must be ready; for the Son of man is coming at an hour you do not expect." The Gospel of the Lord.

OUR

1st SUNDAY OF ADVENT – "Stand ready because the Lord is coming at an hour you do not expect".

"Advent" means "coming". It is the Lord who comes to walk with us in our human life and lead it to the final purpose for which God created us: our eternal salvation after this earthly pilgrimage. But, to this "coming" of the Lord we must respond with going to meet him and welcome him.

The Word of God in this 1st Sunday of Advent assures us the "God is coming" and he will teach us the way of justice, of peace and of truth (Isaiah 2, 1-5). St. Paul, even more strongly says: "Our salvation is now near... The night is almost over, it will be daylight soon" (Rm. 13, 12). The invitation is of getting-up and to go and meet the Lord who comes with a heart full of joy in expectation for what he will say and bring.

The Gospel, then, leads us forward to the final coming of the Lord when he will finally embrace us with love at the end of our life on earth. He wants this eternal encounter with us, he deeply wishes it will happen and therefore he exhorts us: "You must stand ready because the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect" (Mt. 24, 42).

To the loving desire of God to come along with us in our earthly journey in order to lead us to our eternal salvation, our response needs be that of welcoming him and letting him guide us. This is well expressed in the Responsorial Psalm: "Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord". What this really means is: "let us walk in the light of the Lord (Isaiah 2,5). St. Paul uses an even stronger expression: "The night is almost over, it will be daylight soon, wake up!... Let us live decently as people do in the daytime: no drunken orgies, no promiscuity or licentiousness, and no wrangling or jealousy. Put on the armour of the Lord Jesus Christ and do not follow the desires of the flesh" (Rm 13, 13-14). In this is the true spirit of Advent: stand vigilant and be ready to welcome Christ who comes and let him guide us today and up to the final moment of our earthly life.

1.ma DOMENICA DI AVVENTO – "Vegliate perche' non sapete in quale giorno il Signore verra".

L' invito e' quello di alzarci e andare incontro ad accogliere il Signore che viene con un cuore

pieno di gioiosa aspettativa per quello che ci dira' e ci portera'.

Il vangelo poi ci fa' fare uno sbalzo in avanti alla venuta finale del Signore, quando egli compira' il suo gesto di abbracciarci con amore nell'incontro dopo questa vita in terra. Egli vuole questo incontro eterno, lo desidera e percio' ci esorta: "Vegliate, dunque, perche' non sapete in quale giorno il Signore vostro verra" (Mt. 24, 42).

All'atteggiamento premuroso di Dio di venirci incontro sulla strada di questa nostra vita terrena per giuidarci verso la salvezza eterna, la nostra risposta sara' quella di accoglierlo e lasciarci guidare da lui. Ecco allora l'invito del Salmo Responsoriale: "Andiamo con gioia incontro al Signore". In pratica questo significa "camminare nella luce del Signore" (Isaia 2, 5). S. Paolo , con una espressione ancora piu' forte, ci dice: "La note e' avanzata, il giorno e' vicino, svegliatevi!... Comportiamoci onestamente; non in mezzo a gozzoviglie e ubriachezze, non fra impurita' e licenze, non in contese e gelosie. Rivestitevi invece del Signore Gesu' Cristo e non seguite la carne nei suoi desideri" (Rm 13, 13-14). Ecco il vero spirito di Avvento: vegliare per andare incontro e accogliere il Signore che viene e lasciarci guidare da lui, oggi e fino al momento finale della nostra vita terrena.


