A reading from the Letter to the Hebrews (12:5-7,11-13)
Have you forgotten the exhortation which addresses you as sons? – "My son, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord, nor lose courage when you are punished by him. For the Lord disciplines him whom he loves, and chastises every son whom he receives." It is for discipline that you have to endure. God is treating you as sons; for what son is there whom his father does not discipline? For the moment all discipline seems painful rather than pleasant; later it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it. Therefore lift your drooping hands and strengthen your weak knees, and make straight paths for your feet, so that what is lame may not be put out of joint but rather be healed. **This is the Word of the Lord.**

Alleluia, alleluia! May the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ enlighten the eyes of our heart, so that we may know the hope to which he has called us. **Alleluia!** (Eph 1:17,18)

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St Luke (13:22-30)
Jesus went on his way through towns and villages, teaching, and journeying towards Jerusalem. And someone said to him, "Lord, will those who are saved be few?" And he said to them, "Strive to enter by the narrow door; for many, I tell you, will seek to enter and will not be able. When once the householder has risen up and shut the door, you will begin to stand outside and to knock at the door, saying, 'Lord, open to us.' He will answer you, 'I do not know where you come from.' Then you will begin to say, 'We ate and drank in your presence, and you taught in our streets.' But he will say, 'I tell you, I do not know where you come from; depart from me, all you workers of iniquity!' There you will weep and gnash your teeth, when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God and you yourselves thrust out. And men will come from east and west, and from north and south, and sit at table in the kingdom of God. And behold, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last." **The Gospel of the Lord.**

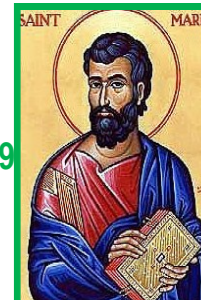

THE CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY
A - THE PERSON AND SOCIETY (From: "Compendium of the Catholic Faith")
401. In what does the social dimension of man consist? (1877-1880;1890-1891) Together with the personal call to beatitude, the human person has a communal dimension as an essential component of his nature and vocation. Indeed, all are called to the same end, God himself. There is a certain resemblance between the communion of the divine Persons and the fraternity that people are to establish among themselves in truth and love. Love of neighbor is inseparable from love for God.



LA COMUNITÀ CRISTIANA
A - LA PERSONA E LA SOCIETÀ
401. In che cosa consiste la dimensione sociale dell'uomo? (1877-1880;1890-1891) Insieme alla chiamata personale alla beatitudine, l'uomo ha la dimensione sociale come componente essenziale della sua natura e della sua vocazione. Infatti: tutti gli uomini sono chiamati al medesimo fine, Dio stesso; esiste una certa somiglianza tra la comunione delle Persone divine e la fraternità che gli uomini devono instaurare tra

loro nella verità e nella carità; l'amore del prossimo è inseparabile dall'amore per Dio.

402. What is the relationship between the person and society? (1881-1882;1892-1893) The human person is and ought to be the principle, the subject and the end of all social institutions. Certain societies, such as the family and the civic community, are necessary for the human person. Also helpful are other associations on the national and international levels with due respect for the principle of *subsidiarity*.

402. Qual è il rapporto tra la persona e la società? (1881-1882;1892-1893) Principio, soggetto e fine di tutte le istituzioni sociali è e deve essere la *persona*. Alcune società, quali la famiglia e la comunità civica, sono ad essa necessarie. Sono utili anche altre associazioni, tanto all'interno delle comunità politiche quanto sul piano internazionale, nel rispetto del principio di *sussidiarietà*.

403. What is the principle of subsidiarity? (1883-1885;1894) The principle of subsidiarity states that a community of a higher order should not assume the task belonging to a community of a lower order and deprive it of its authority. It should rather support it in case of need.

403. Che cosa indica il principio di sussidiarietà? (1883-1885;1894) Tale principio indica che una società di ordine superiore non deve assumere il compito spettante a una società di ordine inferiore, privandola delle sue competenze, ma deve piuttosto sostenerla in caso di necessità.

404. What else is required for an authentic human society? (1886-1889;1895-1896) Authentic human society requires respect for justice, a just hierarchy of values, and the subordination of material and instinctual dimensions to interior and spiritual ones. In particular, where sin has perverted the social climate, it is necessary to call for the conversion of hearts and for the grace of God to obtain social changes that may really serve each person and the whole person. Charity, which requires and makes possible the practice of justice, is the greatest social commandment.

404. Che cos'altro richiede un'autentica convivenza umana? (1886-1889;1895-1896) Richiede di rispettare la giustizia e la giusta gerarchia dei valori, come pure di subordinare le dimensioni materiali e istintive a quelle interiori e spirituali. In particolare, là dove il peccato perverte il clima sociale, occorre far appello alla conversione dei cuori e alla grazia di Dio, per ottenere cambiamenti sociali che siano realmente al servizio di ogni persona e di tutta la persona. La carità, che esige e rende capaci della pratica della giustizia, è il più grande comandamento sociale.

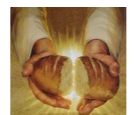


