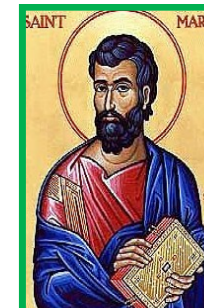

(30) Serialised presentation from: *Compendium of the Catechism*

The Apostles' Creed (continue): The Eternal Judgement.

209. What is meant by the term "heaven"? (1023-1026;1053) By "heaven" is meant the state of supreme and definitive happiness. Those who die in the grace of God and have no need of further purification are gathered around Jesus and Mary, the angels and the saints. They thus form the Church of heaven, where they see God "face to face" (1 Corinthians 13:12). They live in a communion of love with the Most Blessed Trinity and they intercede for us.

210. What is purgatory? (1030-1031;1054) Purgatory is the state of those who die in God's friendship, assured of their eternal salvation, but who still have need of purification to enter into the happiness of heaven.

211. How can we help the souls being purified in purgatory? (1032) Because of the communion of saints, the faithful who are still pilgrims on earth are able to help the souls in purgatory by offering prayers in suffrage for them, especially the Eucharistic sacrifice. They also help them by almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance.

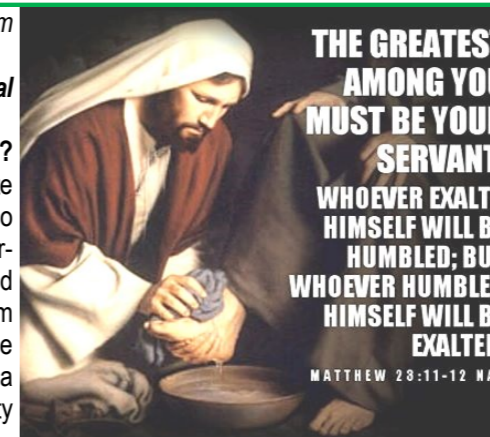
212. In what does hell consist? (1033-1035;1056-1057) Hell consists in the eternal damnation of those who die in mortal sin through their own free choice. The principal suffering of hell is eternal separation from God in whom alone we can have the life and happiness for which we were created and for which we long. Christ proclaimed this reality with the words, "Depart from me, you cursed, into the eternal fire" (Matthew 25:41).

213. How can one reconcile the existence of hell with the infinite goodness of God? (1036-1037) God, while desiring "all to come to repentance" (2 Peter 3:9), nevertheless has created the human person to be free and responsible; and he respects our decisions. Therefore, it is the human person who freely excludes himself from communion with God if at the moment of death he persists in mortal sin and refuses the merciful love of God.

214. In what does the final judgment consist? (1038-1041;1058-1059) The final or universal judgment consists in a sentence of happiness or eternal condemnation, which the Lord Jesus will issue in regard to the "just and the unjust" (Acts 24:15) when he returns as the Judge of the living and the dead. After the last judgment, the resurrected body will share in the retribution which the soul received at the particular judgment.

215. When will this judgment occur? (1040) This judgment will come at the end of the world and only God knows the day and the hour.

216. What is the hope of the new heavens and the new earth? (1042-1050;1060) After the final judgment the universe itself, freed from its bondage to decay, will share in the glory of Christ with the beginning of "the new heavens" and a "new earth" (2 Peter 3:13). Thus, the fullness of the Kingdom of God will come about, that is to say, the definitive realization of the salvific plan of God to "unite all things in Christ, things in heaven and things on earth" (Ephesians 1:10). God will then be "all in all" (1 Corinthians 15:28) in eternal life.



Dal Compendio del Catechismo (30)

LA PROFESSIONE DI FEDE: Il Giudizio Eterno.

209. Che cosa s'intende per «cielo»? (1023-1026;1053) Per «cielo» s'intende lo stato di felicità suprema e definitiva. Quelli che muoiono nella grazia di Dio e non hanno bisogno di ulteriore purificazione sono riuniti attorno a Gesù e a Maria, agli Angeli e ai Santi. Formano così la Chiesa del cielo, dove essi vedono Dio «a faccia a faccia» (1 Cor 13,12), vivono in comunione d'amore con la Santissima Trinità e intercedono per noi.

210. Che cos'è il purgatorio? (1030-1031;1054) Il purgatorio è lo stato di quanti muoiono nell'am-

icizia di Dio, ma, benché sicuri della loro salvezza eterna, hanno ancora bisogno di purificazione, per entrare nella beatitudine celeste.

211. Come possiamo aiutare la purificazione delle anime del purgatorio? (1032) In virtù della comunione dei santi, i fedeli ancora pellegrini sulla terra possono aiutare le anime del purgatorio offrendo per loro preghiere di suffragio, in particolare il Sacrificio eucaristico, ma anche elemosine, indulgenze e opere di penitenza.

212. In che cosa consiste l'inferno? (1033-1035;1056-1057) Consiste nella dannazione eterna di quanti muoiono per libera scelta in peccato mortale. La pena principale dell'inferno sta nella separazione eterna da Dio, nel quale unicamente l'uomo ha la vita e la felicità, per le quali è stato creato e alle quali aspira. Cristo esprime questa realtà con le parole: «Via, lontano da me, maledetti, nel fuoco eterno» (Mt 25,41).

213. Come si concilia l'esistenza dell'inferno con l'infinita bontà di Dio? (1036-1037) Dio, pur volendo «che tutti abbiano modo di pentirsi» (2 Pt 3,9), tuttavia, avendo creato l'uomo libero e responsabile, rispetta le sue decisioni. Pertanto, è l'uomo stesso che, in piena autonomia, si esclude volontariamente dalla comunione con Dio se, fino al momento della propria morte, persiste nel peccato mortale, rifiutando l'amore misericordioso di Dio.

214. In che cosa consisterà il giudizio finale? (1038-1041;1058-1059) Il giudizio finale (universale) consisterà nella sentenza di vita beata o di condanna eterna, che il Signore Gesù, ritornando quale giudice dei vivi e dei morti, emetterà a riguardo «dei giusti e degli ingiusti» (At 24,15), riuniti tutti insieme davanti a lui. A seguito di tale giudizio finale, il corpo risuscitato parteciperà alla retribuzione che l'anima ha avuto nel giudizio particolare.

215. Quando avverrà questo giudizio? (1040) Questo giudizio avverrà alla fine del mondo, di cui solo Dio conosce il giorno e l'ora.

216. Che cos'è la speranza dei cieli nuovi e della terra nuova? (1042-1050;1060) Dopo il giudizio finale, lo stesso universo, liberato dalla schiavitù della corruzione, parteciperà alla gloria di Cristo con l'inaugurazione dei «nuovi cieli» e di una «terra nuova» (2 Pt 3,13). Sarà così raggiunta la pienezza del Regno di Dio, ossia la realizzazione definitiva del disegno salvifico di Dio di «ricapitolare in Cristo tutte le cose, quelle del cielo come quelle della terra» (Ef 1,10). Dio allora sarà «tutto in tutti» (1 Cor 15,28), nella vita eterna.
