

PRAYER IN THE CHRISTIAN LIFE

All times are good for prayer. The Church, however, proposes special times to the faithful to stress and nurture continual prayer: morning and evening prayer, prayers before and after meals, the liturgy of the hours, the Sunday Eucharist, the Rosary and the feasts of the Liturgical Year.

534. What is prayer? (2558-2565;2590) Prayer is the raising of one's mind and heart to God, or the petition of good things from him in accord with his will. It is always the gift of God who comes to encounter man. Christian prayer is the personal and living relationship of the children of God with their Father who is infinitely good, with his Son Jesus Christ, and with the Holy Spirit who dwells in their hearts.



2606;2620) The prayer of Jesus during his agony in the garden of Gethsemani and his last words on the cross reveal the depth of his filial prayer. Jesus brings to completion the loving plan of the Father and takes upon himself all the anguish of humanity and all the petitions and intercessions of the history of salvation. He presents them to the Father who accepts them and answers them beyond all hope by raising his Son from the dead.

544. How does Jesus teach us to pray? (2608-2614;2621) Jesus teaches us to pray not only with the Our Father but also when he prays. In this way he teaches us, in addition to the content, the dispositions necessary for every true prayer: purity of heart that seeks the Kingdom and forgives one's enemies, bold and filial faith that goes beyond what we feel and understand, and watchfulness that protects the disciple from temptation. **545. Why is our prayer efficacious?** (2615-2616) Our prayer is efficacious because it is united in faith with the prayer of Jesus. In him Christian prayer becomes a communion of love with the Father. In this way we can present our petitions to God and be heard: "Ask and you will receive that your joy may be full" (John 16:24).

In questo modo, oltre al contenuto, ci mostra le disposizioni richieste per una vera preghiera: la purezza del cuore, che cerca il Regno e perdona i nemici; la fiducia audace e filiale, che va al di là di ciò che sentiamo e comprendiamo; la vigilanza, che protegge il discepolo dalla tentazione.

545. Perché è efficace la nostra preghiera? (2615-2616) La nostra preghiera è efficace, perché è unita nella fede a quella di Gesù. In lui la preghiera cristiana diventa comunione d'amore con il Padre. Possiamo in tal caso presentare le nostre richieste a Dio e venire esauditi: «Chiedete e otterrete, perché la vostra gioia sia piena» (Gv 16,24).
