A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St Luke (21:5-19) When some were talking about the Temple, remarking how it was adorned with fine stonework and votive offerings, Jesus said, 'All these things you are staring at now – the time will come when not a single stone will be left on another: everything will be destroyed.' And they put to him this question: 'Master,' they said 'when will this happen, then, and what sign will there be that this is about to take place?' 'Take care not to be deceived,' he said 'because many will come using my name and saying, "I am he" and, "The time is near at hand." Refuse to join them. And when you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened, for this is something that must happen but the end is not so soon.' Then he said to them, 'Nation will fight against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes and plagues and famines here and there; there will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven. 'But before all this happens, men will seize you and persecute you; they will hand you over to the synagogues and to imprisonment, and bring you before kings and governors because of my name – and that will be your opportunity to bear witness. Keep this carefully in mind: you are not to prepare your defence, because I myself shall give you an eloquence and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to resist or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, relations and friends; and some of you will be put to death. You will be hated by all men on account of my name, but not a hair of your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives *The Gospel of the Lord.*

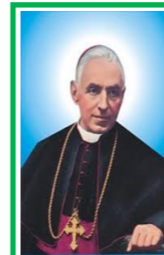

We acknowledge the Wurundjeri people, the traditional owners and custodians of the land on which we stand. We pay our respects to them for their care of the land. May we walk gently on this land.

Brothers and sisters, let us reflect and see if in our lives, in our families, in the places where we daily work and spend our time, we are capable of walking together with others, listening to them, resisting the temptation to lock ourselves up in self-absorption and to think only of our own needs. To walk together – to be "synodal" – is also the vocation of the Church. Let us ask ourselves if we are really communities truly open and inclusive of all; if we cooperate, as priests and laity, in the service of the Gospel; and if we show ourselves welcoming, not only in words but with concrete gestures, to those both near and far, and all those buffeted by the ups and downs of life. Do we make them feel a part of the community? Or do we exclude them? I am troubled when I see Christian communities that divide the world into the good and the bad, saints and sinners: this makes them feel superior to others and exclude so many people that God wants to embrace. Please, always be inclusive: in the Church and in society, which is still marred by many forms of inequality and marginalization. Always be inclusive. Today, the day in which Bishop Scalabrini becomes a saint, I think of emigrants. The exclusion of emigrants is scandalous. The exclusion of emigrants is criminal. They are dying right in front of us, as the Mediterranean is the largest cemetery in the world. The exclusion of emigrants is revolting, sinful and criminal. Not opening doors to those in need – "No, we do not exclude them, we send them away" to camps, where they are exploited and sold like slaves. Brothers and sisters, today let us call to mind these emigrants, especially those who are dying. And those who are able to enter, do we welcome them as brothers and Scalabrini, who founded two Congregations – one male and one female – for the care of emigrants, used to say that in the shared journeying of emigrants we should see not only problems, but also a providential plan. In his words: "Precisely because of the migrations imposed by persecutions, the Church pressed beyond the confines of Jerusalem and of Israel and became 'catholic'; thanks to the migrations of our own days, the Church will be an instrument of peace and of communion among peoples" (*L'emigrazione degli operai italiani*, Ferrara, 1899). The emigration currently taking place in Europe is causing great suffering and forcing us to open our hearts – that is the emigration of Ukrainians who are fleeing from war. Let us not forget war-torn Ukraine. With great vision, Scalabrini looked forward to a world and a Church without barriers, where no one was a foreigner.

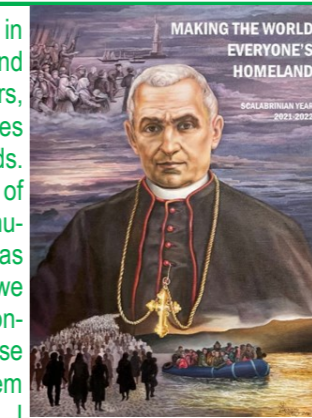

Glory be to the Father St. John Baptist Scalabrini, pray for us!








Chiediamoci se siamo veramente comunità veramente aperte e comprensive di tutti; se cooperiamo, come sacerdoti e laici, al servizio del Vangelo; e se ci mostriamo accoglienti, non solo a parole ma con gesti concreti, verso i vicini e i lontani, e tutti quelli colpiti dagli alti e bassi della vita. Li facciamo sentire parte della

comunità? O li escludiamo? Sono turbato quando vedo comunità cristiane che dividono il mondo in bene e male, santi e peccatori: questo li fa sentire superiori agli altri ed escludere così tante persone che Dio vuole abbracciare. Per favore, siate sempre inclusivi: nella Chiesa e nella società, che è ancora segnata da molte forme di disuguaglianza ed emarginazione. Siate sempre inclusivi. Oggi, giorno in cui il vescovo Scalabrini diventa santo, penso agli emigranti. L'esclusione degli emigranti è scandalosa. In realtà, l'esclusione degli emigranti è criminale. Muoiono proprio di fronte a noi, poiché il Mediterraneo è il più grande cimitero del mondo. L'esclusione degli emigranti è rivoltante, peccaminosa e criminale. Non aprire le porte ai bisognosi - "No, non li escludiamo, li mandiamo via" nei campi, dove vengono sfruttati e venduti come schiavi. Fratelli e sorelle, oggi ricordiamo questi emigranti, specialmente quelli che muoiono. E coloro che possono entrare, li accogliamo come fratelli o li sfruttiamo? Io pongo semplicemente la domanda. Li sfruttiamo? Pongo semplicemente la domanda. Monsignor Scalabrini, che fondò due Congregazioni - una maschile e una femminile - per la cura degli emigranti, diceva che nel comune cammino degli emigranti si dovrebbero vedere non solo problemi, ma anche un piano provvidenziale. Nelle sue parole: "Proprio a causa delle migrazioni imposte dalle persecuzioni, la Chiesa ha spinto oltre i confini di Gerusalemme e di Israele, ed è diventata 'cattolica'; grazie alle migrazioni dei nostri giorni, la Chiesa sarà uno strumento di pace e di comunione tra i popoli" (*L'Emigrazione degli operai Italiani*, Ferrara, 1899). L'emigrazione attualmente in corso in Europa sta causando grandi sofferenze e ci costringe ad aprire i nostri cuori - cioè l'emigrazione degli ucraini che fuggono dalla guerra. Non dimentichiamo l'Ucraina lacerata dalla guerra. Con grande visione, Scalabrini aspettava un mondo e una Chiesa senza barriere, dove nessuno era straniero.

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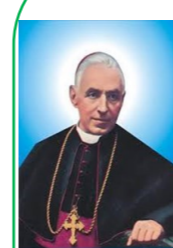

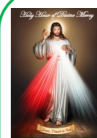
