THE NINTH COMMANDMENT: "YOU SHALL NO **COVET YOUR NEIGHBOR'S WIFE".**

527. What is required by the ninth command ment? (2514-2516; 2528-2530) The ninth command ment requires that one overcome carnal concupi cence in thought and in desire. The struggle again such concupiscence entails purifying the heart and practicing the virtue of temperance.

528. What is forbidden by the ninth command ment? (2517-2519; 2531-2532) The ninth commandment forbids cultivating thoughts and desires connected to actions forbidden by the sixth command ment.

529. How does one reach purity of heart? (2520 In the battle against disordered desires the baptise person is able, by the grace of God, to achieve purit of heart through the virtue and gift of chasti through purity of intention, purity of vision (both exte

rior and interior), discipline of the imagination and of feelings and by prayer.

530. What are the other requirements for purity? (2521-2527; 2533) Purity requires *modesty* which, while protecting the intimate center of the person, expresses the sensitivity of chastity. It guides how one looks at others and behaves toward them in conformity with the dignity of persons and their communion. Purity frees one from wide-spread eroticism and avoids those things which foster morbid curiosity. Purity also requires a purification of the social climate by means of a constant struggle against moral permissiveness which is founded on an erroneous conception of human freedom.



In January 1876, JB Scalabrini was made Bishop Northern Italy. As he visited of Piacenza, 5 times all the 365 Parishes of his Diocese, he noticed that his people, due to poverty and lack of work, were leaving Italy for North and South America and the neighbouring Countries of Europe. Touched by reports of exploitation during the various stages of migration and concerned that many had no one to help them keep their faith in foreign countries, in foreign cultures and language, he felt that something must be done to assist them. The idea of organising a group of priests and sisters to accompany them was then born in his heart.

530. Quali altre esigenze ha la purezza? (2521-2527; 2533)

La purezza esige il pudore, che, custodendo l'intimità della persona, esprime la delicatezza della castità, e regola squardi e gesti in conformità alla dignità delle persone e della loro comunione.

Essa libera dal diffuso erotismo e tiene lontano da tutto ciò che favorisce la curiosità morbosa. Richiede anche una purificazione dell'ambiente sociale, mediante una lotta costante contro la permissività dei costumi, basata su un'erronea concezione della libertà umana.

June 1: Commemorazione del Beato Giovanni Battista Scalabrini Fondatore della Congregazione Scalabriniana A servizio dei Migranti e Rifugiati

Nel gennaio del 1876, GB Scalabrini fu consacrato Vescovo di Piacenza, nel nord Italia. Visitando per ben 5 volte le 365 parrocchie della Diocesi, venne a conoscere che molti fedeli erano emigrati in America o in Europa a causa della poverta' e disoccupazione, subendo molti abusi ed estorsioni nel processo di emigrare. Toccato profondamente da questa realta' di sofferenza e vedendo la necessita' di difendere la loro dignita' e i loro diritti, comincio'a smuovere l'opinione pubblica e la decisione politica di protezione. Anche la,loro fede crisitana era in pericolo in paesi stranieri e lingue sconosciute. Qualcosa bisognava fare! Cosi' nacque nel suo cuore il pensiero di organizzare un gruppo
