#### THE 3<sup>RD</sup> COMMANDMENT:

#### REMEMBER TO KEEP HOLY THE LORD'S DAY

**452.** For what reason has the Sabbath been changed to Sunday for Christians? (2174-2176;2190-2191) The reason is because Sunday is the day of the Resurrection of Christ. As "the first day of the week" (*Mark* 16:2) it recalls the first creation; and as the "eighth day", which follows the sabbath, it symbolizes the new creation ushered in by the Resurrection of Christ. Thus, it has become for Christians the first of all days and of all feasts. It is the *day of the Lord* in which he with his Passover fulfilled the spiritual truth of the Jewish

Sabbath and proclaimed man's eternal rest in God.

453. How does one keep Sunday holy? (2177-2185;2192-2193) Christians keep Sunday and other days of obligation holy by participating in the Eucharist of the Lord (The Mass) and by refraining from those activities which impede the worship of God and disturb the joy proper to the day of the Lord or the necessary relaxation of mind and body. Activities are allowed on Sunday and other days of obligation which are bound up with family needs or with important social service, provided that they do not lead to habits prejudicial to the holiness of Sunday, to family life and to health.

**454.** Why is the civil recognition of Sunday as a feast day important? (2186-2188;2194-2195) It is important so that all might be given the real possibility of enjoying sufficient rest and leisure to take care of their religious, familial, cultural and social lives. It is important also to have an opportune time for meditation, for reflection, for silence, for study, and a time to dedicate to good works, particularly for the sick and for the elderly.

E diventata così, per i cristiani, il primo di tutti i giorni e di tutte le feste: *il giorno del Signore*, nel quale egli, con la sua Pasqua, porta a compimento la verità spirituale del sabato ebraico ed annuncia il riposo eterno dell'uomo in Dio.

453. Come si santifica la domenica? (2177-2185;2192-2193) I cristiani santificano la domenica e le altre feste di precetto partecipando all'Eucaristia del Signore (La S. Messa), e astenendosi anche da quelle attività che impediscono di rendere culto a Dio e turbano la letizia propria del giorno del Signore o la necessaria distensione della mente e del corpo. Sono consentite le attività legate a necessità familiari o a servizi di grande utilità sociale, purché non creino abitudini pregiudizievoli alla santificazione della domenica, alla vita di famiglia e alla salute.

**454.** Perché è importante riconoscere civilmente la domenica come giorno festivo? (2186-2188;2194-2195) Perché a tutti sia data la reale possibilità di godere di sufficiente riposo e di tempo libero che permettano loro di curare la vita religiosa, familiare, culturale e sociale; di disporre di un tempo propizio per la meditazione, la riflessione, il silenzio e lo studio; di dedicarsi alle opere di bene, in particolare a favore dei malati e degli anziani.
