Jesus speaks these words to his disciples in response to the ostentatious lifestyle of some Scribes and Pharisees (Mk 12:38-44). The humble piety of the poor widow

symbolises the total self-emptying and self-giving of Jesus on the Cross for our salvation. Jesus challenges us his disciples to be and act like the poor widow in the story, giving up everything we have, our whole living for him. We can become true disciples when we are willing to detach ourselves from any material possessions, power, unhealthy ambition, selfimage, and fame, all of which, stand in the way of encountering the real person of Christ.

#### Invitation:

Jesus invites us to reach out to others in love. We are called to generously share with others our time, gifts, and possessions. One of the positive things we have learned from this pandemic is the quality time. Think of how we have spent our time during the past lockdown and current covid-19 restrictions. Some of us may have come to realise that how valuable the time we have spent together with our families. Some people have spent time alone. Still others have spent the time dealing with sicknesses or losses in the family. Hopefully, all of us have also spent some time in prayer.

We have just gradually freed from lockdown and now come back to Church. We may still be asked to wear masks but let us open our mouths to proclaim the Good News.
