First reading from the Acts of the Apostles 5:27-32.40-41

We are witnesses to all this: we and the Holy Spirit. The high priest demanded an explanation of the Apostles. 'We gave you a formal warning' he said 'not to preach in this name, and what have you done? You have filled Jerusalem with your teaching, and seem determined to fix the guilt of this man's death on us.' In reply Peter and the apostles said, 'Obedience to God comes before obedience to men; it was the God of our ancestors who raised up Jesus, but it was you who had him executed by hanging on a tree. By his own right hand God has now raised him up to be leader and saviour, to give repentance and forgiveness of sins through him to Israel. We are witnesses to all this, we and the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him.' They warned the apostles not to speak in the name of Jesus and released them. And so they left the presence of the Sanhedrin glad to have had the honour of suffering humiliation for the sake of the name. The Word of the Lord.

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St John (21:1-19) Jesus stepped forward, took the bread and gave it to them, and the same with the fishJesus showed himself again to the disciples. It was by the Sea of Tiberias, and it happened like this: Simon Peter. Thomas called the Twin. Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee and two more of his disciples were together. Simon Peter said, 'I'm going fishing.' They replied, 'We'll come with you.' They went out and got into the boat but caught nothing that night. It was light by now and there stood Jesus on the shore, though the disciples did not realise that it was Jesus. Jesus called out, 'Have you caught anything, friends?' And when they answered, 'No', he said, 'Throw the net out to starboard and you'll find something.' So they dropped the net, and there were so many fish that they could not haul it in. The disciple Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It is the Lord.' At these words 'It is the Lord', Simon Peter, who had practically nothing on, wrapped his cloak round him and jumped into the water. The other disciples came on in the boat, towing the net and the fish; they were only about a hundred yards from land. As soon as they came ashore they saw that there was some bread there, and a charcoal fire with fish cooking on it. Jesus said, 'Bring some of the fish you have just caught.' Simon Peter went aboard and dragged the net to the shore, full of big fish, one hundred and fifty-three of them; and in spite of there being so many the net was not broken. Jesus said to them, 'Come and have breakfast.' None of the disciples was bold enough to ask, 'Who are you?'; they knew guite well it was the Lord. Jesus then stepped forward, took the bread and gave it to them, and the same with the fish. This was the third time that Jesus showed himself to the disciples after rising from the dead. After the meal Jesus said to Simon Peter, 'Simon son of John, do you love me more than these others do?' He answered, 'Yes Lord, you know I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my lambs.' A second time he said to him, 'Simon son of John, do vou love me?' He replied, 'Yes, Lord, vou know I love vou,' Jesus said to him, 'Look after my sheep.' Then he said to him a third time, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' Peter was upset that he asked him the third time, 'Do you love me?' and said, 'Lord, you know everything; you know I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my sheep. 'I tell you most solemnly, when you were young you put on your own belt and walked where you liked; but when you grow old you will stretch out your hands, and somebody else will put a belt round you and take you where you would rather not go.'In these words he indicated the kind of death by which Peter would give glory to God. After this he said, 'Follow me.' The Gospel of the Lord.

Homily notes: 3rd Sunday of Easter Year C

The Gospel for this third Sunday of Easter describes at length an appearance of the risen Lord to seven of the male disciples in a scene by the Lake of Galilee, John 21:1-19. Apart from Jesus himself. Peter is the leading figure - and indeed there are several echoes in this account of St Luke's version of the call of Simon Peter early in his Gospel (Luke 5:1-11): the fruitless fishing all night, the miraculously abundant catch when they follow the instructions of Jesus, a subsequent moment of deep conversion fo

Peter, followed by a specific commissioning of him for a new pastoral

FISHERS OF PEOPLE The scene starts with a reversion on the part of the disciples, led by Peter, to their old trade of fishing. In the wider sequence of the Fourth Gospel, following on from their solemn commissioning and empowerment with the Spirit (20:19-23), this seems to be something of falling-away from their high calling. Perhaps we are meant to take it as such. But in the gospel tradition generally fishing for fish (i.e., ordinary fishing) is a symbol of the mission of the Church Fishers of fish are transformed into fishers of people. The presen narrative describes how an encounter with the risen Lord works this transformation and so 're-founds' the core community of the Church around the pastoral role of Peter. The arrangement of the graveclothes in the empty tomb of Jesus had served as a sign for the 'disciple whom Jesus loved' (13:23: 19:26-27), sparking off his faith in the resurrection (20:6-8). Now the superabundant catch of fish, where previously there had been none, functions again as a sign for his attuned faith. In the distant figure on the shore he recognises the presence of the risen Lord. Simon Peter's spontaneous and extravagant response – jumping into the sea to swim to shore – shows the ardour of love and devotion. But this is a love that is soon to be probed and tested

ONGOING HOSPITALITY

On the shore, Jesus has already prepared breakfast: bread and a charcoal fire with fish cooking on it. The meal to which he invites the disciples takes on eucharistic overtones in the phrases 'he took the bread and gave it to them, and the same with the fish'. What we have in this scene is a nucleus of the Church, which, in the coming time of the physical absence of her Lord, will celebrate and experience in the Eucharist the ongoing hospitality of God that the disciples have received from Jesus.

Note dell'omelia: III Domenica di Pasqua

Il Vangelo di guesta terza domenica di Pasqua descrive a lungo un'apparizione del Signore risorto a sette dei discepoli maschi in una scena sul lago di Galilea, Giovanni 21:1-19. Oltre a Gesù stesso. Pietro è la figura principale - e in effetti ci sono diversi echi in questo racconto della versione di san Luca della chiamata di Simon Pietro all'inizio del suo Vangelo (Luca 5:1-11): la pesca infruttuosa tutta la notte, la pesca miracolosamente abbondante quando sequono le istruzioni di

Gesù, un successivo momento di profonda conversione per Pietro, seguito da una specifica commissione di lui per un nuovo ruolo pastorale.

PESCATORI DI POPOLI

La scena inizia con un capovolgimento da parte dei discepoli, guidati da Pietro, al loro vecchio mestiere di pesca. Nella più ampia seguenza del Quarto Vangelo, che segue la loro solenne messa in servizio e l'empowerment con lo Spirito (20:19-23), questo sembra essere qualcosa di cadere-Iontano dalla loro alta vocazione. Forse dovremmo prenderla come tale. Ma nella tradizione evangelica generalmente la pesca del pesce (cioè la pesca ordinaria) è un simbolo della missione della Chiesa. I pescatori di pesce sono trasformati in pescatori della gente. La presente narrazione descrive come l'incontro con il Signore risorto opera questa trasformazione e così rifonda la comunità centrale della Chiesa attorno al ruolo pastorale di Pietro. La disposizione dei cimiteri nella tomba vuota di Gesù era servita come un segno per il discepolo che Gesù amava (13:23; 19:26-27), scatenando la sua fede nella risurrezione (20:6-8). Ora la pesca sovrabbondante del pesce, dove prima non ce n'era stata, funziona di nuovo come un segno per la sua fede in sintonia. Nella lontana figura sulla riva riconosce la presenza del Signore risorto.

La risposta spontanea e stravagante di Simon Pietro - saltare in mare per nuotare fino alla riva - mostra l'ardore dell'amore e della devozione. Ma questo è un amore che presto sarà sondato e testato.

OSPITALITÀ IN CORSO

Sulla riva, Gesù ha già preparato la colazione: pane e un fuoco di carbone con pesce cucinato su di esso. Il pasto a cui invita i discepoli assume toni eucaristici nelle frasi, ha preso il pane e lo ha dato a loro, e lo stesso con il pesce'. Quello che abbiamo in questa scena è un nucleo della Chiesa, che, nel prossimo tempo dell'assenza fisica del suo Signore, celebrerà e sperimenterà nell'Eucaristia l'ospitalità permanente di Dio che i discepoli hanno ricevuto da Gesù.
