First Reading from the book of Proverbs 8: 22-31

Before the earth came into being, Wisdom was born. The Wisdom of God cries aloud: The Lord created me when his purpose first unfolded, before the oldest of his works. From everlasting I was firmly set, from the beginning, before earth came into being. The deep was not, when I was born, there were no springs to gush with water. Before the mountains were settled, before the hills, I came to birth; before he made the earth, the countryside, or the first grains of the world's dust. When he fixed the heavens firm, I was there, when he drew a ring on the surface of the deep, when he thickened the clouds above, when he fixed fast the springs of the deep, when he assigned the sea its boundaries— and the waters will not invade the shore—when he laid down the foundations of the earth, I was by his side, a master craftsman, delighting him day after day, ever at play in his presence, at play everywhere in his world, delighting to be with the sons of men. *The word of the Lord.*

When I see the heavens, the work of your hands, the moon and the stars which you arranged, what is man that you should keep him in mind, mortal man that you care for him? **R./**

All of them, sheep and cattle, yes, even the savage beasts, birds of the air, and fish that make their way through the waters. **R./**

Second reading from the Romans 5:1-5

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, by faith we are judged righteous and at peace with God, since it is by faith and through Jesus that we have entered this state of grace in which we can boast about looking forward to God's glory. But that is not all we can boast about; we can boast about our sufferings. These sufferings bring patience, as we know, and patience brings perseverance, and perseverance brings hope, and this hope is not deceptive, because the love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit which has been given us. *The word of the Lord.*

Gospel acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; the God who is, who was, and who is to come. **Alleluia!**

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. John 16:12-15



Homily notes:

The Most Holy Trinity Year C

The sense of Three Persons in the One God came into being as a way of expressing the Christian sense of being drawn into the divine communion of love.

DIVINE COMMUNION OF LOVE

So, without injury to the basic monotheism which Christianity derived from the Jewish faith, the sense of Three Persons in the One God came into being – not as a remote heavenly mystery, let alone an arid theological puzzle, but as a way of expressing the Christian sense of being drawn into the divine communion of love. There they found the impulse and energy to be instruments of the saving outreach of that love into the world.

WISDOM TRADITION

From the start the early Christian Church had to reach for patterns in the Old Testament that provided some kind of foretaste and context for the unprecedented "entry" of the divine into the world in the person of the Word. The "Wisdom" tradition provided this best of all. Wisdom is, of course, an attribute or personal quality of God. But in biblical thought such attributes can in a sense become "detached" from God and portrayed as performing functions in a quasi-independent and personal way.

So, in the celebrated passage from Proverbs 8 set down for today's First Reading, we have a poetic evocation of divine Wisdom as a kind of assistant in God's work of creation. ("Wisdom" of course is feminine in Hebrew, and the sense may be that of a little princess, who doesn't so much help with creation but delight in it, as a child will delight in being with her father as he makes beautiful things in his workshop.)

What the passage communicates is the sense of a divine being that is both "with God" (see John 1:1) and also "delighting" in being with the human race. So the Christian tradition picks up here a hint of the personal outreach of God involved in the incarnation.

La Santissima Trinità Anno C

Il senso delle Tre Persone nell'Unico Dio è nato come un modo di esprimere il senso cristiano di essere attirati nella divina comunione d'amore.

DIVINA COMUNIONE DI AMORE

Così, senza pregiudizio per il monoteismo di base che il cristianesimo deriva dalla fede ebraica, il senso di tre persone in un unico Dio è venuto in essere - non come un remoto mistero celeste, figuriamoci un arido puzzle teologico, ma come modo di esprimere il senso cristiano di essere attirati nella divina comunione dell'amore. Lì hanno trovato l'impulso e l'energia per essere strumenti della diffusione di risparmio di quell'amore nel mondo.

RADIZIONE DELLA SAGGEZZA

Fin dall'inizio la Chiesa cristiana primitiva doveva raggiungere modelli nell'Antico Testamento che fornissero una sorta di anticipazione e di contesto per l'inedito "ingresso" del divino nel mondo nella persona del Verbo. La tradizione della "Saggezza" ha fornito questo meglio di tutti. La saggezza è, naturalmente, un attributo o una qualità personale di Dio. Ma nel pensiero biblico tali attributi possono in un certo senso diventare "distaccati" da Dio e raffigurati come esecutori di funzioni in modo quasi indipendente e personale.

Così, nel celebre brano dei Proverbi 8, che è stato preparato per la prima lettura di oggi, abbiamo un'evocazione poetica della Sapienza divina come una sorta di assistente nell'opera della creazione di Dio. ("Saggezza" naturalmente è femminile in ebraico, e il senso può essere quello di una piccola principessa, che non aiuta tanto con la creazione, ma la gioia in essa, come un bambino si diletta a stare con suo padre come lui fa cose belle nel suo laboratorio).

Ciò che il passaggio comunica è il senso di un essere divino che è sia "con Dio" (vedi Giovanni 1:1) sia anche "deliziandosi" nell'essere con la razza umana. Così la tradizione cristiana coglie qui un accenno della sensibilizzazione personale di Dio coinvolto nell'incarnazione.
