We acknowledge the Wurundjeri people, the traditional owners and custodians of the land on which we stand. We pay our respects to them for their care of the land. May we walk gently on this land.

"A leper came to Jesus and pleaded: Lord, heal me!".

The encounter in today's Gospel of the leper with Jesus stands in contrast with the Law of Moses and Jewish practice of the time: from social rejection and condemnation to a healing welcome and restoration. Leprosy was a repulsive sickness considered as a punishment for some serious sins. The leper became rejected by men and by God. Jesus takes a merciful approach instead: touched him and said: "Of course I want to! Be cured!". This encounter makes us, today, reflect on various levels.

Physical sickness is not necessarily a consequence of sin, nor should anyone be rushing judgement against a person. A deep knowledge of certain human behaviour often times helps us understand that personal, family and social conditioning affect our

judgment and values. This is not to find excuse for our misgiving but to make us all conscious of our frailty and pray for strength for sound choices in life. The leper faced with courage the insults of people who saw him coming to Jesus, but his desire for healing made him accept these offences. Healing starts from the knowledge of being sick and courageously seek help. As we soon approach Lent, perhaps, this is a time to make this "walk to Jesus" and ask for healing. Jesus will then touch us - physically - by the raised hand of the Priest in Confession and the words: "Of course, I want: I forgive you all your sins. Go in peace!". Jesus' action in the "touching" the leper is very meaningful. By touching the leper according to the Jewish Law - Jesus becomes "impure" like the leper, rejected and cursed by the people, unable to worship God without first "purifying" himself. Jesus makes himself sharer of the leper's condition. This is what he did by taking on our human nature, subjected to the human infirmities in all ways but sin. As a suffering man (Is.53: 3-12), he endured the consequences of sin. rejected by people and feeling abandoned (on the cross) by God. This is how Jesus "touches" us as he did with the leper; but by his sufferings as a humble and obedient "servant of God", he saved us from our sins. The healing of the leper, today, speaks more of a miracle; it speaks to us all, sinful lepers, in need of spiritual healing. Let us go and throw ourselves at his feet, saying: "Lord, if you want, you can heal me!".

"Un lebbroso venne da Gesú pregandolo: Signore, risanami!".

L'incontro del lebbroso con Gesú, che leggiamo nel Vangelo di oggi, contrasta con la Legge di Mosé e la pratica dei Giudei del tempo: dal rigetto sociale e condanna come peccatore, Gesú offre salute e salvezza. La lebbra era una malattia schifosa, considerata castigo per qualche peccato serio. Perció il lebbroso era rigettato dagli uomini e da Dio. Gesú invece prende un atteggiamento misericordioso: lo toccó e disse: "Certo che lo voglio! Sii risanato!". Questo incontro ci fa riflettere oggi su vari aspetti. La malattia fisica non é di solito una conseguenza del peccato e nessuno puó giudicare e condannare una persona. Una conoscenza profonda del comportamento umano ci aiuta a comprendere che condizionamenti person-

ali, familiari e sociali influiscono sul nostro giudizio e sui valori che ci guidano. Questo non é detto per trovare scuse sul nostro comportamento, ma per renderci consapevoli della nostra fragilità umana e quindi pregare per la forza di fare giuste scelte nella nostra vita. Il lebbroso affrontó coraggiosamente gli insulti della gente che lo vide venire verso Gesú, ma il suo desiderio di essere quarito lo fece accettare queste offese. La salute comincia con l'accettare di essere ammalato e di cercare la cura con coraggio. Stiamo avvicinandoci alla Quaresima e forse questo é il tempo di "andare verso Gesú" e chiedergli di guarirci. Allora Gesú ci toccherá - fisicamente - dalla mano alzata del Sacerdote nella Confessione e dalle parole: "Certo che lo voglio: ti perdono di tutti i tuoi peccati. Va in pace!". Il gesto di Gesú di "toccare" il lebbroso é molto significativo. Toccando il lebbroso - secondo la Legge Ebraica - Gesú si rese "impuro" come il lebbroso, rigettato e condannato dalla gente, e gli viene proibito di avvicinarsi a Dio senza prima "purificarsi". Cosí Gesú partecipa della condizione del lebbroso. E questo é quanto egli fece assumendo la nostra natura umana, soggetto alle varie infermitá umane, ma senza commettere peccato. Come "uomo sofferente" (Is. 53: 3-12) lui accetta le conseguenze del peccato, rigettato dalla gente e sentendosi abbandonato (sulla croce) anche da Dio. Ecco come Gesú ci ha "toccato" come fece con il lebbroso; ma per le sue sofferenze come umile e obbediente "servo di Dio" ci salvó dai nostri peccati. L'episodio del lebbroso oggi ci parla di qualche cosa al di lá del miracolo: ci parla che noi pure, lebbrosi nello spirito, abbiamo bisogno di essere risanati spiritualmente. Andiamo, perció, a gettarci ai piedi di Gesú dicendo: "Signore, se tu vuoi tu puoi sanarmi!".
