The Lord has sworn an oath he will not change. "You are a priest forever, a priest like Melchizedek of old." **R/**

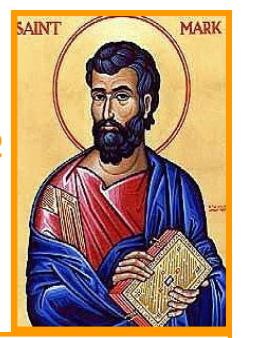
A reading from the First Letter of S. Paula to the Corinthians (11:23-26)
 This is what I received from the Lord, and in turn passed on to you: that on the same night that he was betrayed, the Lord Jesus took some bread, and thanked God for it and broke it, and he said, 'This is my body, which is for you; do this as a memorial of me.' In the same way he took the cup after supper, and said, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Whenever you drink it, do this as a memorial of me.' Until the Lord comes, therefore, every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you are proclaiming his death. *The word of the Lord.*

Gospel acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! I am the living bread which has come down from heaven, says the Lord. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever. *Alleluia!*

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St Luke (9:11-17)

Jesus made the crowds welcome and talked to them about the kingdom of God; and he cured those who were in need of healing. It was late afternoon when the Twelve came to him and said, 'Send the people away, and they can go to the villages and farms round about to find lodging and food; for we are in a lonely place here.' He replied, 'Give them something to eat yourselves.' But they said, 'We have no more than five loaves and two fish, unless we are to go ourselves and buy food for all these people.' For there were about five thousand men. But he said to his disciples, 'Get them to sit down in parties of about fifty.' They did so and made them all sit down. Then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven, and said the blessing over them; then he broke them and handed them to his disciples to distribute among the crowd. They all ate as much as they wanted, and when the scraps remaining were collected they filled twelve baskets. *The Gospel of the Lord.*

Homily notes: Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) Year C

The Eucharist is meant to be the way in which the post-Easter community continues to experience and celebrate the hospitality of God, a pledge and foretaste of the banquet of the final Kingdom.

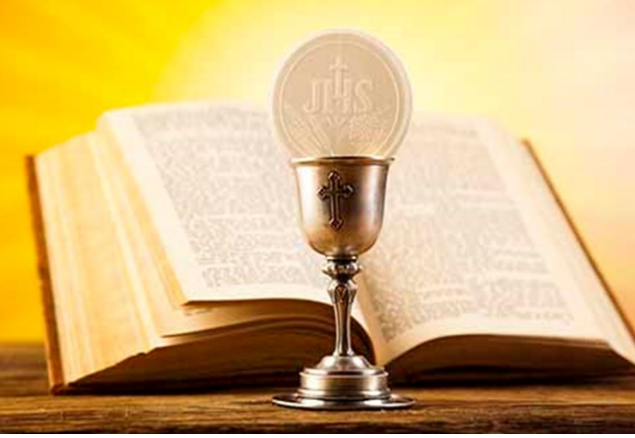
THEME OF HOSPITALITY

The same theme of hospitality is central to the Gospel: Luke's account of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes (9:11-17). (The significance of this tradition in the early Church is clear from the fact that it occurs no less than six times across the full range of the gospels: twice in both Matthew and Mark; once in Luke and John). The twelve apostles, in genuine concern for the well-being of the crowd, make a practical suggestion. It's time to send the people home so that they can find food and lodging for the night. Jesus throws back at them a stark challenge: "Give them something to eat yourselves". In other words, "You provide them with the hospitality they need". They are aghast at the suggestion. In human terms hospitality on such a scale is impossible. But Jesus is going to make them ministers of the hospitality of God.

The people are made to sit down in groups – a clear signal that they are about to be fed. Then, invoking heaven (to show the divine source), blessing and breaking the loaves and fishes (the language has clear echoes of the Eucharistic narrative), he miraculously makes it possible for the Twelve to feed the entire crowd – not merely adequately but so abundantly that, even after all had eaten, each the distributors had a basket full of broken pieces left over. God is never niggardly in hospitality; on the contrary, overflowing abundance is its sign and mark.

FORESHADOWING THE EUCHARIST

It is significant that in the provision of the loaves and fish Jesus himself does not deal directly with the crowd. He leaves the distribution left entirely to the disciples. Jesus is apprenticing them to be ministers of the hospitality of God when, after his ascension, he is physically removed from the scene. The episode, then, clearly foreshadows the Christian Eucharist – the rite in which the Church will experience and celebrate God's hospitality until the time of his return.



Note dell'omelia: Corpo e Sangue di Cristo (Corpus Domini) Anno C

L'Eucaristia vuole essere il modo in cui la comunità post-orientale continua a sperimentare e celebrare l'ospitalità di Dio, pegno e presagio del banchetto del Regno finale.

TEMA DELL'OSPITALITÀ

Lo stesso tema dell'ospitalità è centrale nel Vangelo: il racconto di Luca della moltiplicazione dei pani e

dei pesci (9, 11-17). (Il significato di questa tradizione nella Chiesa primitiva è chiaro dal fatto che essa si verifica non meno di sei volte in tutta la gamma dei vangeli: due volte in Matteo e Marco; una volta in Luca e Giovanni). I dodici apostoli, nell'autentica sollecitudine per il benessere della folla, danno un suggerimento pratico. E' tempo di mandare le persone a casa in modo che possano trovare cibo e alloggio per la notte. Gesù lancia loro una dura sfida: "Date loro qualcosa da mangiare". In altre parole, "Voi offrite loro l'ospitalità di cui hanno bisogno". Sono stupefatti dal suggerimento. In termini umani l'ospitalità su tale scala è impossibile. Ma Gesù sta per renderli ministri dell'ospitalità di Dio.

Le persone sono fatte sedere in gruppi - un chiaro segnale che stanno per essere nutriti. Poi, invocando il cielo (per mostrare la fonte divina), benedice e spezzando i pani e i pesci (il linguaggio ha chiari echi della narrazione eucaristica), egli rende miracolosamente possibile per i Dodici nutrire l'intera folla - non solo in modo adeguato ma così abbondante che, anche dopo che tutti avevano mangiato, ognuno dei distributori aveva un cesto pieno di pezzi rotti rimasti. Dio non è mai avaro nell'ospitalità; al contrario, la sovrabbondanza è il suo segno e segno.

PREFIGURARE L'EUCARISTIA

È significativo che nella fornitura dei pani e dei pesci Gesù stesso non si occupi direttamente della folla. Lascia la distribuzione lasciata interamente ai discepoli. Gesù li sta informando di essere ministri dell'ospitalità di Dio quando, dopo la sua ascensione, viene fisicamente rimosso dalla scena. L'episodio, quindi, prefigura chiaramente l'Eucaristia cristiana - il rito in cui la Chiesa sperimenterà e celebrerà l'ospitalità di Dio fino al suo ritorno.

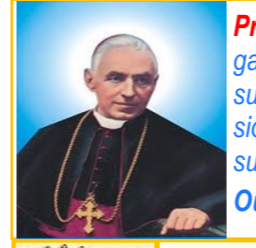


FAMILY FESTIVAL Sunday 26th June 11.00am St. Patrick's Cathedral
