Gospel: Mark 3:20-35 A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

Jesus went home, and such a crowd collected that they could not even have a meal. When his relatives heard of this, they set out to take charge of him, convinced he was out of his mind.

The scribes who had come down from Jerusalem were saying: 'Beelzebul is in him' and, 'It is through the prince of devils that he casts devils out.' So Jesus called them to him and spoke to them in parables, 'How can Satan cast out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom can not last. And if a household is divided against itself, that household can never stand. Now if Satan has rebelled against himself and is divided, he can not stand either - it is the end of him. But no one can make his way into a strong man's house and burgle his property unless he has tied up the strong man first. Only then can he burgle his house.

I tell you solemnly, all men's sins will be forgiven, and all their blasphemies: but let anyone blaspheme against the Holy Spirit and he will never have forgiveness: he is guilty of an eternal sin.' This was because they were saying, 'An unclean spirit is in him.'

The mother and brothers of Jesus arrived and, standing outside, sent in a message asking for him. A crowd was sitting round him at the time the message was passed to him, 'Your mother and brothers and sisters are outside asking for you.' He replied, 'Who are my mother and brothers?' And looking round at those sitting in a circle about him, he said, 'Here are my mother and my brothers. Anyone who does the will of God, that person is my brother and sister and mother.'

HOMILY FOR THE TENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR B

The first reading from Genesis 3:9-15, presented us with the aftermath of the disobedience of God's command by our first parents - Adam and Eve. In this account, Adam blamed Eve for his misconduct and Eve blamed the evil one, (Satan), represented by the serpent. None of them accepted the responsibility for their actions. Hence, the blame game has continued to our today. However, when one makes a wrong choice or commits a sin, one should acknowledge

one's fault and ask for God's mercy by praying, "have mercy on me, God, in your kindness. In your compassion blot out my offence. O wash me more and more from my guilt and cleanse me from my sin. My offences truly I know them, my sin is always before me. Against you, you alone, have I sinned; what is evil in your sight I have done", (Ps 51:1-4).

In the sentencing the devil, (snake), received after the fall of humanity, the Lord said,

I will make you enemies of each other:

you and the woman,

your offspring and her offspring.

It will crush your head

and you will strike its heel.

The Fathers of the Church saw the first promise of God for a saviour of the world in the above quotation, (Protoevangelium). The woman in the story is interpreted as Mary and her 'offspring' is interpreted as Jesus Christ. Thus, Jesus Christ is the one who would crush the head of the serpent, (ie the devil), and the devil will hurt his heels. Jesus' defeat of the devil is decisive through his victory on the cross, while the devil's hurting of Jesus, (Jesus' death), is temporal because Jesus rose again from the dead on Easter Sunday!

Today's Gospel is complex. It presented us with different situations and attitudes people had about Jesus' ministry including the members of his family. People are used to things being either black or white and never grey. The religious leaders and the members of Jesus' family expected Jesus as a holy man, a religious teacher, a prophet and the Son of God, to be associating himself with only the good people in society. Hence, they were scandalised by Jesus' mingling with sinners and those at the margin.

John the Baptist had also presented Jesus as an uncompromising redeemer who would impart the Holy Spirit on people through baptism and gather the wheat into his barn while burning the chaff in everlasting fire. That is, Jesus would be a powerful redeemer who would relate with good people only. However, Jesus reminded us that it is the sick who need the doctor, (Mt 9:12), and that he had come to seek and find all those who were lost, (Lk 19:10).

As Jesus was seeking and rehabilitating those who were lost, including those who were held in the clutches of the devil, (Mk 3: 20-35), the scribes accused him of casting out devils through the power of 'Beelzebul' the prince of devils. Jesus reminded them that they were far away from the truth. He was the one prophesied in the book of Genesis who would crush the head of the serpent.

In Jesus saying that, "no one can make his way into a strong man's house and burgle his property unless he has tied up the strong man first", he presented himself as the one who is stronger than Satan and therefore, he is able to dispossess the devil of his spoils. He can free those held under bondage by the devil. Jesus is our redeemer and, in his name, "every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father, (Phil2:10-11). While it is true that some of those regarded as being possessed by the devil in Jesus' time may have been having psychiatric problems, through the discoveries of modern medicine, evil is real and there are people possessed by the evil one.

Jesus also said in the Gospel of today, that all human sins will be forgiven except sin against the Holy Spirit. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that, "There are no limits to the mercy of God, but anyone who deliberately refuses to accept his mercy by repenting, rejects the forgiveness of his sins and the salvation offered by the Holy Spirit. Such hardness of heart can lead to final impenitence and eternal loss", (CCC 1864). The Church expounds the sins against the Holy Spirit to include despair, presumption of God's mercy, resisting divine truths known as such, envying the spiritual goods of others, obstinacy in sin and final impenitence.
