

HOMILY: GLORYING IN THE CROSS OF CHRIST



My dear sisters and brothers in Christ, today we welcome this jubilee cross which has been blessed by our Archbishop, His grace, Denis Hart DD, to commemorate the golden jubilee of the catholic charismatic renewal. The Holy Spirit is the principle of life and unity. In the Nicene Creed, we profess the Holy Spirit as "the Lord and giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, and who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified."

The Holy Spirit builds bridges among people of different nationalities and cultures and enables us to become one body in Christ. This was typified on the day of Pentecost when people from different nationalities and cultures who had converged in Jerusalem to celebrate the 'feast of Weeks' or the giving of the Torah (Law/ Commandments) to the people of Israel at Sinai, were able to listen to the Good News of the Lord joyfully as a family. The Holy Spirit is also our comforter, He "comes to help us in our weakness. For when we cannot choose words in order to pray properly, the Spirit himself expresses our plea in a way that could never be put into words". (Rm 8:26) This Spirit lavishes His gifts on us and on the church. St Paul reminds us that, "There are diversity of gifts, but the Spirit is the same. There is diversity of ministries, but the Lord is the same. There is diversity of works, but the same God works in all". The charisms given to the church in the service of the mission of Christ by the Holy Spirit included; apostleship, service, teaching, faith, healing, miracles, prophecy, discernment, speaking in tongues, interpretation of tongues, administration, hope and love (1Cor 12:1-13:13).

The Holy Spirit will always lead us to Jesus for it is through the power of the Holy Spirit that we can confess Jesus as our Lord. Let us then "glory in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, in whom is our salvation, life and resurrection...." (entrance antiphon, Exaltation of the Cross). In the first reading, taken from the Book of Numbers, we read that when the people of Israel were dying from bites from poisonous snakes in the desert, God instructed Moses to make a fiery serpent and put it on a standard, and if anyone who was bitten by a snake looked at the raised fiery serpent, he would not die. Moses followed the Lord's instruction and hung a fiery serpent on the standard, and it came to pass that anyone who gazed at the lifted fiery serpent after having been bitten by a fiery serpent, lived to tell the story. This fiery serpent that Moses hung on the standard, or the blood of lamb that the Jews smeared on their door post in Egypt, or Abraham attempting to sacrifice his son Isaac were all prefiguring Jesus Christ. The Book of Hebrews tells us that, "the blood of bulls and goats are incapable of taking away sins" (Heb 10:4) Christ is the true lamb of God that takes away the sins of the world and brings us true healing and peace. He was the one who was lifted up to the altar of sacrifice on the cross and through his wounds we have all been healed (1Pt 2:24) and salvation has been brought to the whole world. He is our messiah, our joy and our hope. He rejoices with us in our moments of gladness and weeps with us in our moments of sorrow.

In the gospel of today, Jesus while speaking to Nicodemus, a member of the Jewish Sanhedrin insisted that, "... the Son of Man must be lifted up as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him". The Gospel of Mark narrated Jesus' death on the cross in this way; "and Jesus uttered a loud cry and breathed his last. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. And when the centurion, who stood facing him, saw that in this way he breathed his last, he said, "Truly this man was the Son of God!" (Mk 15:37-39). Notice that the curtain of the temple was torn from top to bottom and not from bottom to top. The position from which the curtain was torn underscored that it was a divine intervention and not a mere human act. Jesus has made it possible for us to have direct access to the Father. One of the soldiers who had witnessed the manner of Jesus' death came to faith and confessed, "Truly this man was the Son of God." Let us continue to acknowledge Jesus as our personal Lord and Saviour and let us approach his cross with faith for it is not a mere wood but the throne of God's mercy.

WHAT HAPPENED TO THE ANTI-**EUTHANASIA PETITIONS WE SIGNED?**

Over the last three weeks I have attempted on several occasions to seek an appointment with the MP for Frankston. Paul Edbrooke, to present the petition forms containing hundreds of your names and addresses, and to discuss with him the concerns the Catholics of Frankston have as regards the forthcoming assisted suicide legislation to be sponsored by the Andrews government.

I eventually realised I was being given the "run around" and late last week asked his office if that was so. One of his staff eventually admitted as much in a message to the effect that I would not be given the appointment I had been seeking because Mr. Edbrooke had already made up his mind on the matter. The tone of the message left me on no doubt whatsoever that Mr. Edbrooke does not want to hear what your concerns are, which I found extremely disappointing. Nevertheless it is my intention to deliver the completed petition forms to Mr. Edbrooke's office, as I undertook to do on your behalf, even if I am not granted an interview.
