## Gospel (JB) John 6:41-51

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

The Jews were complaining to each other about Jesus, because he had said, 'I am the bread that came down from heaven.' 'Surely this is Jesus son of Joseph' they said. 'We know his father and mother. How can he now say, "I have come down from heaven"?' Jesus said in reply, 'Stop complaining to each other.

'No one can come to me unless he is drawn by the Father who sent me, and I will raise him up at the last day.

It is written in the prophets: They will all be taught by God, and to hear the teaching of the Father, and learn from it, is to come to me. Not that anybody has seen the Father, except the one who comes from God:

he has seen the Father. I tell you most solemnly, everybody who believes has eternal life. I am the bread of life.

Your fathers ate the manna in the desert and they are dead; but this is the bread that comes down from heaven,

so that a man may eat it and not die. I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world.'

The Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.



# Homily, Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B



In the first reading, (1Kg 19:4-8), prophet Elijah had had many challenging experiences in his ministry. Ahab and his wife Jezebel led the Israelites to the worship of Baals. Elijah confronted Ahab about the abomination he and his wife had brought on Israel. Ahab was unrepentant so Elijah informed him that the land of Israel would be punished with drought until they repented of their evil ways. Hence, for two and half years there was no rain in Israel. Elijah had to go on self-exile because his life was in danger in Israel.

Firstly, he settled at wadi Cherith which is west of Jordan, and later he moved to Zarephath, a Sidonian town. After two and half years, he came back to Israel and confronted 450 prophets of Baal at Mt Carmel. The prophets of Baal were to kill a bull and not set fire to it but call on Baal to consume it by fire. The prophets of Baal killed their bull and immolated themselves but the carcass was not consumed by fire. At the time of the evening sacrifice, Elijah killed his own bull, he dug a trench, placed the bull in the trench and filled the trench with water. He then called on the name of the Lord, fire came down and consumed the carcass of his bull. The people then rose against the prophets of Baal and lynched them. They returned back to the worship of the one true God and rain fell again in the land of Israel.

When Jezebel heard that the prophets of Baals had been eliminated, she was furious with prophet Elijah and swore to kill him. Her threats led Elijah to go on another self-exile. This time, he went to Mount Horeb. These challenging experiences that Elijah had gone through explain the raison d'être of his outburst in the first reading of today in which he wished he was dead. He said "'Lord...I have had enough. Take my life; I am no better than my ancestors.'"

At times in life, calamities come in chains. One may lose one's job, then a family member becomes sick or dies, and so on. We remember the story of Job, how he went from being a happy, wealthy husband and father to becoming a destitute - his children and flock died in mysterious circumstances, his body became infested with ulcers and his wife became heartbroken and deserted him.

There may be times in our lives that we need to own up and admit that we can no longer go it alone. We would have to seek help or whole-heartedly accept assistance if offered to us.

Elijah was exhausted and he laid hopelessly under a tree in frustration. He however, received help from angels who provided him with nourishment, (scones). Reinvigorated by the food, he was able to walk to Mount Sinai, (Horeb), where his ancestors had encountered God in a special way and God had made a covenant with them to be their God, and his ancestors, (the people of Israel), became the people of God. During the time of the covenant, the Lord had appeared to the people of Israel in majesty and awe. There was lightning, thunder, land tremor and smoke on Mount Sinai. But in the present encounter with God, Elijah encountered His presence in a gentle breeze.

Just as Elijah was sustained by the miraculous food that was provided for him by the angels, so are we nourished by the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Jesus is our living bread that came down from heaven, (Jn 6:41-51), that we may have life and have it to the fullest.

As we approach the Table of the Lord, let our minds not be distracted by the humanity of Jesus. A considerable number of Jews could not get their heads around the fact that Jesus was the incarnated Son of God because they knew his "father and mother." Let us put our faith and trust in Jesus and we shall experience the fullness of life for he is our bread of life that has come down from heaven and who ever partakes of him has eternal life!
