
Gospel Matthew 15:21-28

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Jesus left Gennesaret and withdrew to the region of Tyre and Sidon. Then out came a Canaanite woman from that district and started shouting, 'Sir, Son of David, take pity on me. My daughter is tormented by a devil.' But he answered her not a word.

And his disciples went and pleaded with him. 'Give her what she wants.' they said 'because she is shouting after us.' He said in reply, 'I was sent only to the lost sheep of the House of Israel.' But the woman had come up and was kneeling at his feet. 'Lord,' she said 'help me.' He replied, 'It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the house-dogs.' She retorted, 'Ah yes, sir; but even house-dogs can eat the scraps that fall from their master's table.' Then Jesus answered her, 'Woman, you have great faith. Let your wish be granted.' And from that moment her daughter was well again.

HOMILY: HOMILY FOR THE 20TH SUNDAY IN THE ORDINARY TIME, YEAR A.



The context of the first reading from the book of prophet Isaiah is the post Babylonian exile. Isaiah had prophesied that the return of the exiles from Babylon after 70 years of captivity will be something new that was to supersede the exodus. "Thus says Yahweh... do not dwell in the past, or remember the things of old. Look I am doing a new thing: now it springs forth. Do you not see? I am opening up a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." (Is 43:14-19)

In the first reading of today (Is 56:1.6-7), the Jews have returned from their Babylonian captivity and God through the mouth of prophet Isaiah gave the returnees the new code of conduct. No one is to be excluded or ostracised from the house of God - the foreigners, castrates, etc. God is going to accept the offerings of all those that call upon his name; for He is God for all thepeople and his house is to be known as a house of prayer.

In the second reading, (Rom 11:13-15.29-32), Paul stated that the conversion of the non-Jews to Christianity was a way of luring the Jews to the true faith. A faith that is no longer a prerogative of the Jews alone but belongs to the whole of humanity.

The Gospel (Matt 15:21-28), presented us with the encounter between Jesus and a Canaanite woman whose daughter was sick. Some of the words of Jesus to the woman may sound offensive to many people of our time. However, it may have been a common parlance in Jesus' time or a joke from Jesus or a way to test the woman's persistency. None-the-less, the woman refused neither to be stereotyped nor to allow political correctness or incorrectness to deter her soul's yearning, for she believed that Jesus was the messiah before putting her request to him. She had addressed Jesus as "Son of David" which was one of Jesus' messianic titles. Through this encounter, it became clear to us, that one becomes a member of God's house by faith not merely by biological descent. Jesus told the Canaanite woman " Woman, you have great faith. Let your wish be granted. And from that moment her daughter was well again". The salvation brought to us by Jesus belongs to everyone: Jews and non-Jews alike. Jesus demonstrated this by sending his disciples both to the Jewish towns (Mt 10:5-6)) and to the non-Jewish towns (Lk 10:1) Jesus' out stretched arm on the cross is an invitation for everyone to come to him. Peter said in the Acts of the Apostles that he had come to the realisation that God has no favourites, but that every person who believes in God is acceptable to Him. Peter came to this awareness after the Holy Spirit fell on the family of Cornelius who was of a non-Jewish descent (Acts 10: 44-46).

The faith that makes us members of God's House is sealed by baptism. For among the baptised, "there is no distinction between Jew and Greek, between circumcised and uncircumcised. There are no strangers, barbarians, slaves or free men, but Christ is all and in all." Col 3:11

ANTI-EUTHANASIA UPDATE

Rumour has it that the Andrews government may first introduce its assisted suicide legislation into the Victorian Legislative Council, where there may be more support for it than in the Legislative Assembly, where legislation is, traditionally, introduced first.

In any event the Bill must be approved by both Houses, but this move is a sure sign that the government is not as confident as it would have us believe, and is feeling the pressure of the actions of pro-life, anti-euthanasia voters.

Would you please direct your attention to the five members who represent us in the South Eastern Metropolitan Region of the Legislative Council:

If you write a personal letter to each of these parliamentarians, stating clearly and concisely that you see better funding of palliative care, not assisted suicide, as the best response to incurable illness, you may work wonders. Remember the words of Associate Professor Ian Haines from last week's newsletter:

"As an oncologist with 35 years' full-time experience, I have seen palliative care reach the point where the terminally ill can die with equal or more dignity than euthanasia will provide."

If the assisted suicide legislation is ever going to be introduced into the Victorian Legislative Council, it will be in early September, so we have a fortnight to try to ensure that it never makes it.

Child Safety Policy

Excerpt from Policy dated *9 February 2017*: **Principles**

The Catholic Church has a moral, legal and mission-driven responsibility to create nurturing environments where children are respected, their voices are heard and they are safe and feel safe (CAM Commitment Statement to Child Safety).

The following principles underpin our commitment to child safety at St Francis Xavier's Parish Frankston:

- * Our parish has zero tolerance of child abuse.
- * All children are entitled to, as a fundamental right, safety and protection from all forms of abuse and neglect.
- * Our parish works in partnership with families and the community to ensure that they are engaged in decision-making processes, particularly those that have an impact on child safety and protection.
- * All adults in our parish, including staff, clergy, volunteers, parishioners, contractors, have a responsibility to care for children and young people, to positively promote their wellbeing and to protect them from any kind of harm or abuse.
- * The policies, guidelines and codes of conduct for the care, wellbeing and protection of children are based on honest, respectful and trusting relationships between adults and children and young people.
- * All persons involved in situations where harm is suspected or disclosed must be treated with sensitivity, dignity and respect.
- * Staff, clergy, volunteers, parents, parishioners including children and contractors should be free to raise concerns about child safety, knowing these will be taken seriously by the parish leadership.
- * Appropriate confidentiality will be maintained, with information being provided to those who have a right or a need to be informed, either legally or pastorally.
