HOMILY FOR TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR A

King Cyrus or Cyrus the great was an important person in the Jewish history, even though he was a non-Jew. He was a Persian conqueror and emperor. It was under his reign that the Jews could return to Palestine seventy years of captivity in Babylon. Prophet Isaiah had prophesied about him by name about one-hundred and fifty years before his birth. The Lord referred to Cyrus as his "anointed" and stated that, "It is for the sake of my servant Jacob, of Israel my chosen one, that I have called you by your name, conferring a title though you do not know me." In this prophesy of Isaiah, we realise that God can use anyone to achieve his purpose. Another good example of how God can use anyone to achieve his purpose is St Patrick. He was non-Irish and a former slave in Ireland, who escaped, become a priest and went back to Ireland to proclaim the Gospel of Christ to the Irish people. The prophesy of Isaiah regarding Cyrus was fulfilled when in his first year of reign as the emperor of Persia, he issued the following decree:

"Thus speaks Cyrus King of Persia: The Lord the God of heaven, who has given me all the kingdoms of the earth, has ordered me to build him a house in Jerusalem. In Judah. Now, all of you who belong to his people, go there and may the Lord your God be with you" (2Chr 36:22-23). Cyrus was gracious to the Jews in building the temple by offsetting the building cost from his treasury (Ezra 1:4–11; 6:4–5). The Jews were in Babylonian captivity for seventy years as prophesied by prophet Jeremiah, "This is what the Lord says, when the seventy years in Babylon have been completed I will come to you and fulfil my gracious promise to you and bring you back to this place" (Jer 29:10). The first reading, prophesied the coming of Persia as a super power. This came to fruition by the conquest of Babylon by King Cyrus. This conquest led to the liberation of the people of Israel. During the time of Jesus, the people of Israel were under another occupation by the reigning super power – Rome. The reigning emperor then was Tiberius Caesar.

Many Jews were against the occupation of their land by a foreign power and they were also opposed to the coins minted by the Roman government because it was engraved with the head of the reigning emperor Tiberius Caesar. The Jews believed that the commandments of God forbade the making of images and the worshipping of other gods. The reverse side of the coin had an inscription "Tiberius Caesar, august son of the divine Augustus, High Priest". There were Jews who were willing to physically fight the occupation, these were known as the zealots. However, there were those who supported the occupation and were willing to work with the occupying power, some of them were known as the Herodians. In the Gospel of today the Pharisees who were opposed to the occupation of Palestine by a pagan power connived with the Herodians to entrap Jesus. Do I in what I say or do try to entrap someone?

Palestine under the Roman occupation was a heavily taxed nation. There were three forms of taxes that that were imposed on the people by the Roman administration; a ground tax (1/10 of the produce of the land), an income tax (1/10 of the person's income) and a poll tax (an equivalent of a daily wage). These taxes were collected by the Publicans like Matthew and Zacchaeus before their conversions. The tax collectors were often hated for two principal reasons. Firstly, they were agents of the occupying power and secondly, they often extort from the people more than the required levies and embezzle the extra funds they obtained illegally. The Pharisees and the Herodian parties asked Jesus if it was "permissible to pay taxes to Caesar?" This question put Jesus in a dilemma. If he answered in the affirmative, he will be accused of supporting the Roman occupation, and if he answered in the negative, he will be accused of insurrection against the Roman government. Jesus' answer that we should "give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God", is a gentle affirmation that we have physical and spiritual needs and both are to be catered for. While we are undertaking our civic responsibilities, we should never shelve our relationship with God. Though our country is a secular society in which everyone is free to practice the faith of one's choice, however, freedom of religion should however never be confused with freedom from religion in which our society gets rid of anything religious. A ociety in which one is forbidden to display Christmas decorations in public arena or to say merry Christmas.

Excerpt from Policy dated 9 February 2017: Policy Commitments

All children at St Francis Xavier's Parish have the right to feel safe and be safe. The wellbeing of children in our care will always be our first priority and we do not and will not tolerate child abuse. We aim to create a child-safe and child-friendly environment where children are free to enjoy life to the full without any concern for their safety. There is particular attention paid to the most vulnerable children, including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children, children from culturally and/or linguistically diverse backgrounds, and children with a disability.

What should be Reported.

- A disclosure made by a child of abuse of any kind
- ◆ Through observance of events that causes a person to form an objectively reasonable belief that a child is being harmed or abused, or at risk of being harmed or abused by eitherfamily or another person
- By actual witness of an event or incident
- A lost child, a child injured or a medical emergency during a Parish activity.
