

## **GOSPEL**

Luke 9:28-36


A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Jesus took with him Peter and John and James and went up the mountain to pray. As he prayed, the aspect of his face was changed and his clothing became brilliant as lightning. Suddenly there were two men there talking to him; they were Moses and Elijah appearing in glory, and they were speaking of his passing which he was to accomplish in Jerusalem. Peter and his companions were heavy with sleep, but they kept awake and saw his glory and the two men standing with him. As these were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, 'Master, it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' - He did not know what he was saying. As he spoke, a cloud came and covered them with shadow; and when they went

into the cloud the disciples were afraid. And a voice came from the cloud saying, 'This is my Son, the Chosen One. Listen to him'. And after the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. The disciples kept silence and, at that time, told no one what they had seen.

## **Homily - First Sunday of Lent, Year C**

The Transfiguration of Jesus took place on Mount Tabor. Mountains have been places where people en counter the divine. Abraham went to sacrifice his son Isaac on a mountain in Moriah, (Gen 22); the

Lord gave the Israelites the ten commandments at Mount Sinai, (Ex 20); Prophet Elijah defeated the prophets of Baal at Mount Carmel, (1Kg 18:17-40); Jesus gave his sermon which included the beatitudes on a mountain, (Mt 5); and Jesus was crucified on Golgotha which was a mountain.

The Transfiguration of Jesus Christ was like an eureka moment for his disciples; an aha experience. In the Gospel of today the human body that veils the divinity of Christ was lifted in the context of prayer. For we read in the Gospel that "Jesus took with him Peter, and John and James and went up the mountain to pray", (Lk 9:28). When the disciples experienced the divinity of Jesus they exclaimed through Peter, "Lord, it is wonderful to be here". They realised instantaneously, that Jesus is the fulfilment of the covenant God made with Abraham, (the First Reading), whose unflinching faith in God made him justified. They also came to the awareness that Jesus is the gate to heaven because at Jesus' Transfiguration, his disciples also communed with the saints in glory in the person of two Old Testament Pillars – Moses and Elijah.

We are now invited to put our faith and trust in Jesus who has set us free through his Cross and Resurrection. Just as Abraham put his faith in God, so are we invited to have unwavering faith in Jesus who as the new Moses and Elijah would lead us to the promised land where God is all in all.

Today as we reflect on the Transfiguration of Christ, I invite you to also reflect on how the message of Christ has transformed the Church and her members to be advocates for the voiceless in our society.

The first, (encyclical), letter of a pope to address social justice issues was a letter written to all patriarch, bishops, priests and lay people by Pope Leo XIII on 15<sup>th</sup> May, 1891. It was titled **Rerum Novarum**, (On New Things). It upheld the dignity of human labour and defended the right to private property. It criticised radical socialism and extreme capitalism. It also defended the right of workers to form unions! This letter was in response to industrial revolution.

On 11th April, 1963, Pope John XXIII, who convened the second Vatican Council, issued an optimistic encyclical, (letter), titled, Pacem in Terris, (On Establishing Universal Peace in Truth, Justice, Charity and Liberty). The background to this encyclical was the establishment of the United Nations to forestall future conflicts after the horrors of the Second World War, the emergence of Cold War, arms race and the adoption of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights by the United Nation General Assembly in 1948.

The theological basis of Pacem in Terris is 'marvellous order' found in God's "Natural Law". Pope John XXIII declared that every person has the right to life, "the right to bodily integrity and to the means necessary for the proper development of life", (n.11).

In 1991, following the collapse of Communism in 1989, and to commemorate the centenary of Rerum Novarum, (the letter by Pope Leo XIII), Pope John Paul released a letter titled, *Centesimus Annus*, (on the hundredth anniversary of *Rerum* Novarum). John Paul excoriated Communism for failing the people by denying rights to workers. It also criticised Communism for sponsoring atheism that have denied meaning and purpose to the younger generations. John Paul support ed capitalism that has a heart; "It is not wrong to want to live better; what is wrong is a style of life which is presumed to be better when it is directed towards 'having' rather than 'being', and which wants to have more, not in order to be more but in order to spend life in enjoyment as an end in itself," (# 36).

With the debate ranging between those who believe that climate change is real and climate change sceptics, Pope Francis in his 2015 Encyclical, (letter), "Laudato Si" (on climate change), sided unequivocally with those who believe that climate change is real. He stated that climate change is real, and it is a moral issue that everyone, especially the Catholics, must address in order to protect the earth and everyone living in it.

The principles of Catholic Social teaching include life and dignity of the human person, the call to family, community, and participation; rights and responsibilities; options for the poor and vulnerable; the dignity of work and the rights of workers; solidarity and care for God's creation.

I salute and congratulate individuals and groups, governmental and non-governmental agencies that are in the forefront of mitigating the divide between the rich and the poor especially those at the margin of the society. These individuals, groups and governmental agencies provide advocacy, legal aid, food, medical treatment, allowances and accommodation to the needy. Here, I wish to acknowledge the bold government initiatives of Centre-link and Medicare. I recognise the invaluable services provided by St Vincent de Paul, Salvation Army, Meals on Wheels, Doctors Without Borders and so on.

May our Transfigured Christ, give us the grace to take care of our environment and to be always mindful of the needs of the less privileged in our communities for he said, I was hungry and you feed me, thirsty and you gave me drink, lonely and you visited me. (Mt 25:31-46).
