# GOSPEL—Luke 5:1-11

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

*They left everything and followed him.* 

Jesus was standing one day by the Lake of Gennesaret, with the crowd pressing round him listening to the word of God, when he caught sight of two boats close to the bank. The fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats - it was Simon's and asked him to put out a little from the shore. Then he sat down and

When he had finished speaking he said to Simon, 'Put out into deep water and pay out your nets for a catch.' 'Master,' Simon replied 'we worked hard all night long and caught nothing, but if you say so, I will pay out the nets.' And when they had done this they netted such a huge number of fish that their nets began to tear, so they signalled to their companions in the other boat to come and help them; when these came, they filled the

When Simon Peter saw this he fell at the knees of Jesus saying, 'Leave me, Lord; I am a sinful man.' For he and all his companions were completely overcome by the catch they had made; so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were Simon's partners. But Jesus said to Simon, 'Do not

be afraid; from now on it is men you will catch.' Then, bringing their boats back to land, they





## Homily - Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C

The First Reading, (Is 5:1-6), narrated the call of Isaiah as a prophet of the Lord. Isaiah saw a vision of the Lord where the Temple was filled with smoke and the angels of the Lord sang

"Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts. His glory fills the whole earth." Isaiah felt grossly unworthy of the vision he had seen because he realised that he was a sinner. "I am a man of unclean lips and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have looked at the King, the Lord of hosts." An angel took a live coal from the altar and touched his lips and informed him that his sins has been cleansed. Then as the voice of the Lord cried out, "Whom shall I send? Who will be our messenger?", Isaiah responded, "Here I am, send me." Isaiah was sent by God to bring His word of conversion and consolation to the people of Israel who were facing an assault from the Assyrian Empire.

In the Gospel, (Lk 5:1-11), Jesus continued to proclaim the Good News about the Kingdom of God, and a large crowd followed him because they were hungry to hear the word of God. As he arrived at the Lake of Gennesaret, he got into a boat by the bank of the lake to avoid being crushed by the crowd. The boat happened to belong to Simon Peter. Jesus asked Peter to pull a few meters away from the bank so that he might sit on the boat as he gave his sermon.

After giving his sermon, he asked Peter to "Put out into deep water and pay out your nets for a catch." Peter, who was an expert fisherman, was initially reluctant to follow the command from Jesus, because he and his companions had had sleepless night on the lake and had caught nothing. On second thought, he unenthusiastically followed Jesus' instruction and put out into deep water.

To his utter amazement, they netted so much fish that their net was tearing. They had to signal to their friends in the other boat to come and help them. When their friends arrived, they were able to fill the two boats to sinking point with the fish they had netted. Peter immediately understood that this phenomenon was not an accident but that a miracle had just taken place. In the presence of the Divine, he immediately acknowledged his inadequacy as he knelt and said to Jesus, "Leave me, Lord; I am a sinful man."

Prophet Isaiah and Peter acknowledged their sinfulness in the presence of the Divine. As Peter lamented about his weaknesses, Jesus gave him words of encouragement and informed him that he has been chosen to become a fisher of people. He was to use the skills of a fisherman to channel people to Christ, especially the Jewish people.

Paul in the Second Reading, (1Cor 15:1-11), was a persecutor of the Christians before he encountered Jesus in a special way. Paul had a theophany on his way from Jerusalem to Damascus to arrest the Christians. That singular experience transformed him from a hater of Christ to an apostle of Christ. For Paul, "everything else is worthless when compared with the infinite value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have discarded everything else, counting it all as garbage, so that I could gain Christ and become one with him," (Phil 3:5-11). Though he was unworthy of God's grace because of his persecution of the Christians, none-the-less, Christ still chose him as his ambassador because of his, (Christ's), graciousness. Paul was commissioned as an apostle to the gentiles.

Like Prophet Isaiah, and Saints Peter and Paul, God calls us in spite of our inadequacies but we are not indispensable to Him. As Christ's ambassadors let us join in our Parish Mission of spreading the Good News of God's Peace and Justice.
