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

GOSPEL

John 14:23-29

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John
The Holy Spirit will teach you everything and remind you of all I have said to you.

Homily

From the First Reading of last Sunday, we learnt that the Church in Antioch, which was originally started through the work of Deacon Philip and animated by the ministries of Paul and Barnabas, was a thriving outward looking Christian community which embraced people from different cultural

backgrounds.

Within the nascent Christian communities, there were competing views on whether one should be made culturally a Jew first before one can become a Christian or whether a non-Jew can become a follower of Christ without culturally being a Jew. In one of the covenants God made with patriarch Abraham, (Gen 17:1-27), all the male children born to him or his descendants, and all their male servants, or foreigners who choose to live in Jewish communities, were to be circumcised. Abraham was ninety-nine years old when he underwent circumcision. Per the letter of this covenant, any male who was not circumcised could not be a Jew.

We read from the First Reading, (Acts 15:1-2, 22-29), that, "some men came down from Judaea and taught the brothers, 'Unless you have yourselves circumcised in the tradition of Moses you cannot be saved.' This led to disagreement and, after Paul and Barnabas had a long argument with these men, it was arranged that Paul and Barnabas and others of the church should go up to Jerusalem and discuss the problem with the apostles and elders." The teaching of these men from Judaea should also be seen within the context of the missionary work of Paul and Barnabas in which many non-Jews had come to faith that Jesus was their Lord and Saviour.

Paul and Barnabas had taught the gentiles, following the teachings of Jesus, that one is saved by believing in Jesus as their Messiah and in accepting Baptism in the name of Jesus. Jesus had taught that one is saved by being born again through water and the Holy Spirit, (Jn 3:5-6), that is, Baptism. While Jesus was hanging on the cross a soldier pierced his side with the lance and water and blood gushed out from his side, which symbolised Baptism and the Eucharist respectively. Again, after the Resurrection of Jesus Christ at his Ascension, he commissioned his disciples to go out and make disciples of all the nations baptising them "in the name of the Father and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit," (Mt 28:19-20).

Following this controversy in Antioch which, if not resolved, had a propensity to shatter the foundation of the Church, Paul and Barnabas accompanied by some other members of the Antiochian Church travelled to Jerusalem to consult with the Apostles and the Elders on the issue. Christ in the Gospel of today, (Jn 14:23-29), had promised to send the Holy Spirit to be with his Church, to clarify his, (Jesus'), teachings in moments of doubt and to remind us all what Jesus had taught. Again, in the Gospel, Jesus bequeathed peace to his Church, he said, "Peace I bequeath to you, my own peace I give you, a peace the world cannot give, this is my gift to you." It implies that whenever disputes arise, the Church must allow herself to be led by the Holy Spirit in resolving the conflict, so that peace and harmony can be restored to the community, allowing the love of Christ to shine out in the community like the lily.

The conflict in Antioch gave rise to the First Council of Jerusalem. The Apostles and the Elders convened a meeting with the delegates from Antioch. Having listened to their complaint, the Apostles and the Elders, being led by the Holy Spirit and in the light of the teachings of Jesus Christ, concluded that one does not need to be culturally a Jew first before one can become a Christian. To the contrary, Baptism, they agreed was our common bond and that makes us members of the Body of Christ.

However, life calls us to make some sacrifices for the common good. Hence, the Apostles and Elders recommended that the non-Jews should observe some table etiquette so that there would be peace and harmony between the Jews and the non-Jews in the community. The non-Jews were asked to abstain from food sacrificed to idols, from eating animal blood and meat of strangled animals, because blood had not flowed out from the animal. Both Jews and the non-Jews were invited to keep the Commandments of God.


