When the sabbath was over, Mary of Magdala, Mary the mother of James, and Salome, bought spices with which to go and anoint him. And very early in the morning on the first day of the week they went to the tomb, just as the sun was rising.

They had been saying to one another, 'Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?' But when they looked they could see that the stone - which was very big - had already been rolled back. On entering the tomb they saw a young man in a white robe seated on the right-hand side, and they were struck with amazement. But he said to them, 'There is no need for alarm. You are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified: he has risen, he is not here. See, here is the place where they laid him. But you must go and tell his disciples and Peter, "He is going before you to Galilee; it is there you will see him, just as he told you."


Gospel: John 20:1-9


A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.' So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

EASTER MESSAGE

My dear people of God,
The Lord has risen indeed, Alleluia!

The resurrection of Jesus Christ is central to our Christian faith, for if Christ had not risen from the dead, then, our faith in him would have been in vain (1 Cor 15:14). The resurrection of Jesus Christ was the dominant message proclaimed in the early church. Jesus during his ministry had prophesied about his resurrection. He stated that, "the Son of man was destined to suffer grievously, and to be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes, and to be put to death, and after three days to rise again." (Mark 8:31)

By his resurrection, Jesus triumphed over evil and over any situation that holds us in bondage. We recall the joy the Jews had when they escaped from their place of slavery in Egypt and also eluded the Egyptian army that chased after them. After they had miraculously crossed the Red Sea and arrived at Mount Sinai, they sang a song of Joy in praise of God:

I will sing to the Lord, glorious his triumph!
Horse and rider has thrown into the sea!
The Lord is my strength, my song, my salvation.
this is my God and I extol him,
my father's God and I give him praise (Ps 15:1-2)



Our hearts too like the Jews in the dessert are full of Joy, because Jesus' resurrection assures us of our redemption. Since Jesus has set us free through his suffering, death, and resurrection, we ought to examine our consciences as individuals and as a church to find out if there are people we ought to set free. We apologise for all forms of child abuse that had been perpetuated by members of the church, whether the abuse was by a church personnel or parents or relations or friends of the family. We acknowledge that such negative behaviours by some members of the church faithful are inimical to the Good news proclaimed by Christ and the freedom won for us by Christ's suffering, death and resurrection. We ask for forgiveness from all those who are feeling betrayed or hurt by the church.

The resurrection of Jesus marks a new beginning. God had prophesied through the mouth of Prophet Isaiah that He was going to do something new:

For I am about to do something new. See, I have already begun! Do you not see it? I will make a pathway through the wilderness. I will create rivers in the dry wasteland. The wild animals in the fields will thank me, the jackals and owls, too, for giving them water in the desert. Yes, I will make rivers in the dry wasteland. So, my chosen people can be refreshed (Is 43:19-20)

Hence, this is a time of a new beginning; a time to reconnect with the church if you have distanced yourself from her. Easter is also a time of the Lord's jubilee when those held in bondage (like in jubilees of old) are set free. Just as Jesus has set us free from our sins, so are we invited to expunge all forms of oppressiveness from our lives. Are you oppressive to your spouse? Are parents oppressive to their children? Are children hostile to their parents? Are siblings hostile to each other? Are you oppressive to your friends? Are employers oppressive to the employees? Are employees holding their employers in hostage? Are governments oppressive to their citizens? Are citizens holding their governments hostage? Have we allowed pride, greed, revengefulness, envy, laziness, gambling, alcohol, illicit drugs, money, wealth, cigarette, sports and poverty to hold us in bondage? Let us allow the light of the risen Christ to shine into our lives, dispelling the darkness of sin and addictions, healing our hurts and bringing back joy and hope into our lives. Jesus can transform your life for he said, "come to me all you who are burdened and heavy laden, I will give you rest" (Matt 11:28). As you approach the throne of God's mercy that Jesus Christ has won for you through his resurrection may you receive grace upon grace! Amen. Happy Easter!
