This Sunday 's Readings: **1st Reading Daniel 7:9-10. 13-14** & **2nd Reading 2 Peter 1:16-19**

Gospel Matthew 17:1-9 *A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew*

His face was shining like the sun. Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone. There in their presence he was transfigured: his face shone like the sun and his clothes became as white as the light. Suddenly Moses and Elijah appeared to them; they were talking with him. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Lord,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He was still speaking when suddenly a bright cloud covered them with shadow, and from the cloud there came a voice which said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him.' When they heard this, the disciples fell on their faces, overcome with fear. But Jesus came up and touched them. 'Stand up,' he said 'do not be afraid.' And when they raised their eyes they saw no one but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain Jesus gave them this order, 'Tell no one about the vision until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.'

HOMILY: THE TRANSFIGURATION OF JESUS

The transfiguration of Jesus took place on Mount Tabor. Mountains have been a place where people encounter the divine; Abraham went to sacrifice his Son Isaac on a mountain at Moriah (GEN 22); The Lord gave the Israelites the ten commandments at Mount Sinai (EX 20); Prophet Elijah defeated the prophets of Baal at Mount Carmel (1Kg 18:17-40); Jesus gave his sermon which included the beatitudes on a mountain (Mt 5); and Jesus was crucified at Golgotha which was a mountain.

The transfiguration of Jesus Christ was like a eureka moment for his disciples; an aha experience. It is like a major episode in one's life that one can never forget. It can be compared to the experience of Jacob in Genesis 28:10-19. Jacob had a dream in Bethel in which he saw angels of God ascending and descending from heaven via a staircase and the voice of God assuring him that He was the God of Abraham and Isaac. When Jacob woke up from sleep he exclaimed that God is in this place and I was not aware of it. He then built an altar to the Lord. It was a great revelation and a memorable experience for him. Another aha experience is also found in the hymn 'Amazing Grace' where it reads, 'I was blind and now I see'. The seeing has a positive transforming effect.

No one wants to forget a Eureka moment or an aha experience; we reminisce about them. This explains why Peter wanted to build three tents – For Jesus, Moses and Elijah. The Psalmist said, "one thing I ask of the Lord and this I long; to dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life" (Ps 27:4). But this aha moment on the mountain was only a foretaste of the joy that shall be ours if we remain faithful and walk in the foot step of Christ. It was also to prepare the disciples of Jesus for the scandal of the cross. It was a way to reassure the disciples of Jesus that the passion and crucifixion of Jesus will not be the last chapter of his story, but it will lead to the glorification of Jesus as Lord. Hence, Jesus and his disciples had to climb down the mountain to 'drink the cup' (Mt 20:22) that leads to eternal glory. This drinking of 'the cup' was the passion and crucifixion for Jesus and martyrdom for the apostles of Jesus.

In the Gospel of today, the human body that veils the divinity of Christ was lifted in the context of prayer. For we read in the Gospel that "Jesus took with Him Peter, and John and James and went up the mountain to pray" (Lk 9:28). When the disciples experienced the divinity of Jesus as the second Person in the Blessed Trinity, they exclaimed through Peter, "Lord, it is wonderful to be here". They realised instantaneously, that Jesus is the one on whom sovereignty, glory and kingship has been conferred upon by God and that his sovereignty was eternal (the first reading). They also came to the awareness that Jesus is the gate to heaven because at his transfiguration, his disciples also communed with the saints in glory in the person of two Old Testament Pillars – Moses and Elijah. Moses was a great prophet and law giver. It was to him that God gave the ten commandments. The first five books of the Old Testament (Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy) are ascribed to him. Elijah was a great prophet who called down fire from heaven to consume the meat of sacrifice on mount Carmel, thus proving to the people of Israel that Yahweh is the only true God and not Baal. Elijah was taken up into heaven by the whirlwind (1Kg 2)

The appearance of Moses and Elijah at the transfiguration of Jesus was to handover the baton to Jesus. Jesus is the fulfilment of all the Old Testament prophecies. The Old Testament was the time of preparation for the coming of Christ. Now that Christ has taken the stage, all the pillars of the old Testament will have to acknowledge Jesus as the Lord. Hence, in the gospel of today, the Father's voice was heard, affirming Jesus as the new authority in matters of faith when He said, "This is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased, listen to him." We are now invited to put our faith and trust in Jesus who has set us free through his cross and resurrection.



Thus far, the only local member of the Victorian Parliament to respond to the petition that many of you endorsed during June, has been Inga Peulich, MLC, Member for South-East Metropolitan Region. She is firmly against the assisted suicide legislation being proposed by the Andrews government. Mr. Paul Edbrooke, MLA, the Member for Frankston, has announced that he will be supporting the assisted suicide legislation being proposed by the Andrews government. However, Mr. Edbrooke, like any politician, could be persuaded to change his mind. Therefore, I suggest that those of you who have already written to him do so again, and that those who have not yet written to him seriously reconsider doing so. In view of his reluctance to reply previously to pro-life voters, I suggest that you all insist on a reply to your concerns about assisted suicide and euthanasia.
