As summer progresses in Australia, invariably great bushfires break out. Those who report the infernos speak not only of the flames, but often of a mighty roar like a great windstorm heralding the approaching fire.

The earth had quaked at the death of Jesus, but death had been conquered and the earth was supercharged with divine energy and vitality. Into all this the Risen Lord sent his Holy Spirit like a lightning strike. Divine energy was unleashed and St Luke portrays this particular event in our bushfire terms. The Holy Spirit, he says, was 'like tongues of fire' and 'like the sound of a mighty wind' accompanying the descent of the Holy Spirit on a gathering

<u>St. Brigid's Parish</u> – Pentecost Sunday (Year A)

Introduction: Today we celebrate Pentecost Sunday, the birthday of the Church. We commemorate the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles, and how their immediate transformation was a sign of the presence of the Spirit as if a new creation.

1st Reading: Acts 2:1-11

We hear a description of the events of the first Pentecost, in which St Luke uses images resonant of the creation story in Genesis to show that the era of the Spirit is a new creation.

2nd Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:3-7

In this reading Paul introduces the analogy of the human body for the Church as the Body of Christ. This metaphor almost becomes his trade mark.

Gospel: John 20:19-23

We hear the events on the night of the resurrection, when the Risen Jesus greeted the disciples by saying "receive the Holy Spirit".

Prayer of Intercession On this birthday of the Church we pray to the Holy Spirit that it guide the Church in this time just as the early Christian community responded to the presence of the Spirit.

We pray that our Church leaders, especially Pope Francis, be inspired by the Spirit to proclaim the Gospel 1. of life.

They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak different languages.

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'
