REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate

When he was crucified Jesus uttered: 'It is finished.' What had finished? His earthly ministry during which he painted a picture of the most intimate communion between Himself, the Father, and the Holy Spirit, so intimate that the Church needed a new word: 'TriUnity' or 'Trinity' for short.

God is pulsating, shimmering light, dancing in threefold exchange of love, each being simultaneously poured into the other. God is 'Being-In-Love' and love is always relational.

'You are made in the image and likeness of God'? Because of the ministry of Jesus Christ, we know what that really means. We are made to live in relationship – not in solitary.

If we think that the ultimate good is to be self-sufficient/autonomous, that leads to a hellish existence. When we live with as much selfgiving as is possible, we are on the way to a heavenly existence.

We could pause for a moment to give thanks for the revelation of the nature of God, and consequently of the true nature of human beings.

St. Brigid's Parish – The Most Holy Trinity (Year A)

<u>Introduction</u>: Having concluded the Easter season we continue with the Ordinary Time of our Sunday Liturgy with the celebration of the Feast of the Trinity. Baptised in the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, we are reminded of how central is the Trinity in our faith.

1st **Reading:** Exodus 34:4-6, 8-9

We hear the story of how Moses encounters the Lord on Mount Sinai. It is a symbol of God's mercy and compassion for all who come into his presence.

2nd Reading: 2 Corinthians 13:11-13

We hear how St. Paul urges the Christian community at Corinth to live the faith they proclaim. His greeting is the formal text we use at the beginning of Mass.

Gospel: John 3:16-18

These words spoken by Jesus to Nicodemus are at the heart of the Trinitarian plan of salvation: "God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son..."

<u>Prayers of Intercession</u>: In our prayers for the Community, we make the Christian response of praying to the Father through the Lord Jesus in the power of his Spirit.

1. We pray as Christians that we recognise the life of the Trinity we share in baptism as we look now to be strengthened in that grace by this Eucharist.

2. We pray that our Christian life be understood as an expression of faith in the Trinity, every time we make the sign of the cross and conclude a prayer.

4. We pray for support for all those people who work for the Church in all areas of the media, that they may be rewarded for their labours in reaching out to those drawn to hear God's word.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

We, pray for those in our parish who are sick, especially *Eileen S, Corrine V, Megan B, Andrew M, Michael W, Glenys O, Anthony S, Ryan F, Jessica C, Cheryl L, Stephania C, Kylie I, George T, Bill P, Jacqueline D, Amanda H, Beau S & Fran S.* We pray for the recently deceased and for those who are grieving. We pray also for those whose anniversary occurs at this time, especially Santiago, may they share the fullness of divine life which is our Christian hope.
