Each year, Catholics from all corners of Australia gather on Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Sunday to celebrate the unique gifts and contributions of Australia's First Peoples. This year's theme,

#### "A New Life in Christ"

reflects the hope and promise of a brighter future, rooted in unity and shared commitment to positive change.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait islander Sunday symbolises our unity as one people in Christ, and we urge both indigenous and non-indigenous Catholics to come together in every Catholic Parish and School across this great Southern land.

# **REFLECTION** by Fr Michael Tate

In the early Church, Christianity ripped families apart. Good Jewish families would have been appalled to see their sons and daughters go off to follow a crucified blasphemer. Good reason to keep apart in the synagogue, avoiding damnable pollution. This sectarianism contrasted with the Christians who fearlessly went out into the world.

St John Paul II personified what it is to be Catholic. But, he pressed a prayer into a crack in the Wailing Wall in Jerusalem and as an old man shuffled across the floor of a Mosque in Syria.

Of course, there was no compromise of belief and faith in the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, denied by both Jews and Muslims. But his actions were not those of one with the siege mentality of the member of a cult. Rather, he was able to respond to the promptings of the Holy Spirit to take these steps recognising what was good amongst the *adherents* of those faiths.

We could pause for a moment to implore the Holy Spirit to break us out from any constricting cult-like tendencies so that we can go out into the world powerfully proclaiming the resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ.



#### St. Brigid's Parish – Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year A)

<u>Introduction</u>: We continue with the mission theme from Matthew's Gospel as Jesus instructs the Twelve about their attitudes and openness to the task ahead. We, too, are called to witness to Gospel values.

#### **1**st **Reading**: 2 Kings 4: 8-11, 14-16

We hear a wonderful story of hospitality shown to the prophet Elisha, and we are reminded that those who welcome a prophet in the Lord's name will receive a prophet's reward.

#### **2<sup>nd</sup> Reading:** Romans 6: 3-4, 8-11

St. Paul reminds us that in baptism we go down into the tomb with Christ and are baptised into his death so that we are raised up with him to new life.

#### **Gospel:** Matthew 10: 37-42

In this final segment of Matthew's mission sermon to the Twelve, Jesus emphasises that the ties that bind those who accept Jesus' Word are stronger than any other relationship.

<u>Prayer of Intercession</u>: Confident in the promise of God's faithfulness to us, we open our hearts in petition for the hopes, the hurts, and the needs of all.

1. We pray that the successors of the Apostles in the College of Bishops with the Pope, will be strengthened in their role to take up the cross and follow in the footsteps of Jesus.

4. We pray in thanksgiving for the generosity and sacrifices of all those parishioners who have supported our parish communities. May the Spirit reward them with the prophet's reward as God knows best.

# A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

Having been buried with him through baptism, we shall walk in a new life.

When we were baptised in Christ Jesus we were baptised in his death; in other words, when we were baptised we went into the tomb with him and joined him in death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the Father's glory, we too might live a new life.

But we believe that having died with Christ we shall return to life with him: Christ, as we know, having been raised from the dead will never die again. Death has no power over him any more. When he died, he died, once for all, to sin, so his life now is life with God; and in that way, you too must consider yourselves to be dead to sin but alive for God in Christ Jesus.

#### A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Anyone who does not accept his cross is not worthy of me. Anyone who welcomes you, welcomes me.

Jesus instructed the Twelve as follows: 'Anyone who prefers father or mother to me is not worthy of me. Anyone who prefers son or daughter to me is not worthy of me. Anyone who does not take his cross and follow in my footsteps is not worthy of me. Anyone who finds his life will lose it; anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it.

'Anyone who welcomes you welcomes me; and those who welcome me welcome the one who sent me. 'Anyone who welcomes a prophet because he is a prophet will have a prophet's reward; and anyone who welcomes a holy man because he is a holy man will have a holy man's reward. 'If anyone gives so much as a cup of cold water to one of

these little ones because he is a disciple, then I tell you solemnly, he will most certainly not lose his reward.'
