Dear Parishioners

I would like to extend my gratitude to Kevin Petherbridge, who has recently stepped down from his role as Chairperson of the Child Safety Committee at St. Brigid's, for his commitment to the very important task of bringing our Parish into line with the guidelines set out by the Archdiocese. It has been a huge job and I thank Kevin for his work.

I note in the Parish Pastoral Council Minutes that 75% of our Parish volunteers have supplied a current WWCC or VIT registration. Whilst this is a great starting point; there is a still as significant number that do not have the required documentation needed to volunteer within the parish.

Together with the Archdiocese, I see this as a priority; therefore those without the required documentation will be contacted in the coming weeks to arrange for their WWCC to be completed. Our parish secretary, Tam, will co-ordinate this work. I'd like to emphasize that those without the appropriate documentation will be unable to continue in their volunteer role after 31 October, 2023. Please feel free to contact Tam if you require help obtaining your WWCC.

"WOMEN DEACONS & the SYNOD: WHAT HAPPENS NOW?"

On 7 August 2023 (10-11:30am AEST) the ACU Centre for Liturgy will host Dr Phyllis Zagano (Hofstra University, New York) who will give an online public lecture (via Zoom) entitled "Women Deacons and the Synod: What Happens Now?"

Most of the Continental Assemblies and the syntheses of several Episcopal Conferences call for the question of women's inclusion in the diaconate to be considered at the Synod on Synodality. Is it possible to envisage this, and in what way?" She will address the questions: What are the arguments for and against women ordained as deacons? What will happen in October? Dr Zagano is an internationally acclaimed Catholic scholar and lecturer on contemporary spirituality and women's issues in the church.

St. Brigid's Parish – Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year A)

<u>Introduction</u>: Through Jesus' parables we realise that the hidden work of God is going on around us all the time, if only we know how to recognize it.

1st **Reading:** Wisdom 12:13, 16-19

We hear a selection from the Book of Wisdom. This is chosen to go with the parables that make up today's Gospel. Our God is a God of justice and mercy.

2nd Reading: Romans 8:26-27

We hear a brief but powerful word from Paul. The Spirit comes to help us in our weakness. God also knows everything in our hearts.

Gospel: Matthew 13:24-43

We again hear the parables of Jesus about the hidden action of the Kingdom. They indicate that the universality of the Kingdom in God's plan is greater that the smallness of the human way of thinking.

<u>Prayer of intercession</u>: The book of Wisdom gives us hope. It is hope that moves us today to bring before God's mercy the hopes and dreams of all who long for His Word.

1. We pray for the Church as the witness to the Kingdom. May all levels within the Church learn to temper their enthusiasm to pull up the weeds and destroy the harvest as well. May they leave the judgement to God.

First Reading

Wisdom 12:13. 16-19

A reading from the book of Wisdom.

In the place of sin, you give repentance.

There is no god, other than you, who cares for everything, to whom you might have to prove that you never judged unjustly.

Your justice has its source in strength, your sovereignty over all makes you lenient to all.

You show your strength when your sovereign power is questioned and you expose the insolence of those who know it; but, disposing of such strength, you are mild in judgement, you govern us with great lenience, for you have only to will, and your power is there.

By acting thus you have taught a lesson to your people how the virtuous man must be kindly to his fellow men, and you have given your sons the good hope that after sin you will grant repentance.

Gospel

Matthew 13:24-43

(or shorter form Mt 13:24-30)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew.

Let them grow together until the harvest.

Jesus put a parable before the crowds, 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a man who sowed good seed in his field. While everybody was asleep his enemy came, sowed darnel all among the wheat, and made off. When the new wheat sprouted and ripened, the darnel appeared as well. The owner's servants went to him and said, "Sir, was it not good seed that you sowed in your field? If so, where does the darnel come from?" "Some enemy has done this" he answered. And the servants said, "Do you want us to go and weed it out?" But he said, "No, because when you weed out the darnel you might pull up the wheat with it. Let them both grow till the harvest; and at harvest time I shall say to the reapers: First collect the darnel and tie it in bundles to be burnt, then gather the wheat into my barn." He put another parable before them, 'The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed which a man took and sowed in his field. It is the smallest of all the seeds, but when it has grown it is the biggest shrub of all and becomes a tree so that the birds of the air come and shelter in its branches.' He told them another parable, 'The kingdom of heaven is like the yeast a woman took and mixed in with three measures of flour till it was leavened all through.' In all this Jesus spoke to the crowds in parables; indeed, he

In all this Jesus spoke to the crowds in parables; indeed, he would never speak to them except in parables. This was to fulfill the prophecy:

I will speak to you in parables and expound things hidden since the foundation of the world.

Then, leaving the crowds, he went to the house; and his disciples came to him and said, 'Explain the parable about the darnel in the field to us.' He said in reply, 'The sower of the good seed is the Son of Man. The field is the world; the good seed is the subjects of the kingdom; the darnel, the subjects of the evil one; the enemy who sowed them, the devil; the harvest is the end of the world; the reapers are the angels. Well then, just as the darnel is gathered up and burnt in the fire, so it will be at the end of time. The Son of Man will send his angels and they will gather out of his kingdom all things that provoke offences and all who do evil, and throw them into the blazing furnace, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth. Then the virtuous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Listen, anyone who has ears!'

This is the Gospel of the Lord.
