REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate

Jesus had a sense of humour! Simon, son of Jonah, was far from being a rock solid supporter of Jesus. So Jesus gave him the nickname 'Rocky' which in the Greek is Petros.

Jesus puns with the nickname: 'You are Rocky and upon this rock I will build *my* church.' The natural personality of shifting sands was being transformed by the blessing just given (the only blessing bestowed upon an apostle by Jesus).

Notice that Jesus only makes promises about 'my church', not a church shaped by human imagination, e.g. modes of Roman Imperial rule or with a Eurocentric mindset.

Fortunately, we have a successor of St Peter responding to our Risen Lord's command to St Francis of Assisi, 'Rebuild *my* church'.

We could pause for a moment to pray that the Risen Lord showers the 265th successor of St Peter with every blessing so that the Church of Jesus the Christ continues to prevail over the forces of death which threaten humanity.

ACBC Social Justice Sunday

The Bishops invite us, as Catholics, to begin a new engagement with the First Peoples to overcome injustice, an engagement grounded in love. This love is at the heart of Jesus' message. This love is characterised by a commitment to encounter and dialogue, reciprocity, mutual accompaniment and a desire to put the other at the centre of our attention. The Bishops offer us some simple actions which could help us to begin this new engagement. The Bishops do not tell us how to vote in the referendum, but they encourage us to inform ourselves about the issues through respectful dialogue, especially with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples.

The Bishops and NATSICC join together at the conclusion of the statement to call for us all to walk together in love on a journey of healing, whatever the outcome of the Voice referendum.

St. Brigid's Parish - 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year A)

<u>Introduction</u>: Peter is a central figure in the foundation of the Church. In the Gospel readings we see both sides of his character that reveal his generosity and goodwill but that he also has feet of clay.

1st Reading: Isaiah 22:19-23

This passage offers insight into how confused was the expectation of the role of authority and leadership focused on the future Messiah.

2nd Reading: Romans 11:33-36

We hear a quotation from an early Christian hymn which is dealing with the failure of Israel to accept the Gospel of Jesus. But God's wisdom remains the same.

Gospel: Matthew 16:13-20

In this passage Peter interprets the role of Jesus as the Messiah and Son of God. In turn Jesus confers Peter's new name and prepares him for his new role as Church leader.

<u>Prayer of Intercession</u>: With St. Paul proclaiming the "depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God", which flow from the heart of His love, we seek an answer for all who have entrusted themselves to us in prayer.

- 1. We pray for today's successor of St. Peter, Pope Francis. May he be guided and supported by the Holy Spirit as he proclaims to the world who is the Christ of the Living God.
- (**pause**) We pray to the Lord.

- 2. We pray for the children of our parish who will be receiving the Sacrament of Holy Communion this weekend. May they feel God's love surround them as they continue on their faith journey.
- (pause) We pray to the Lord.

- (pause) We pray to the Lord.

4. We pray for migrants who call Australia home. May Australia, which is continually blessed and enriched with the diversity which migrants bring, become a home for migrants and their families. Also, for the families of migrants left behind may we be attentive to their needs.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say the Son of Man is?' And they said, 'Some say he is John the Baptist, some Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he said 'who do you say I am?' Then Simon Peter spoke up, 'You are the Christ,' he said, 'the Son of the living God.' Jesus replied, 'Simon son of Jonah, you are a happy man! Because it was not flesh and blood that revealed this to you but my Father in heaven. So I now say to you: You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church. And the gates of the underworld can never hold out against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven: whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.' Then he gave the disciples strict orders not to tell anyone that he was the Christ.
