## COLUMBAN PARTNERSHIP FUNDRAISER

We held a very successful day last Sunday, 8<sup>th</sup> October, with our social gathering and film afternoon at Reading's Cinemas, Sunbury. Whilst ticket sales were slow to begin with, we eventually managed to sell 90 tickets with 84 in attendance on the day.

Lynne Piacentini conducted her raffle and hand-knitted stall, and raised over \$450. Raffle winners were, 1<sup>st</sup> Lance Redman, 2<sup>nd</sup> Maureen Redman and 3<sup>rd</sup> Vicki Johnstone. ## **REFLECTION** by Fr Michael Tate

The servants of the king went out and gathered in 'all whom they found, good and evil alike'. They respond, drawn by the attractive prospect of sharing in the life of the Lord of the Feast, and they are welcomed, whether good or evil.

What about the king's (God's) question to the wedding guest? 'My friend, how come you are here without a wedding garment?' The guest might have replied: 'Because of dire poverty', or 'Lack of time', but the story goes on, 'But the guest was silent'. The guest was tonguetied because he was caught out having decided not to enter into the spirit of the occasion.

That is why, at every baptism, we look for a signal of commitment to respond to the spirit of the occasion, by the wearing of a white garment. This anticipates the later receiving of Holy Communion which is a foretaste of the Feast of Heaven.

We could pause for a moment at this Mass to enter into the Spirit of the occasion wearing the garment of our baptismal commitment.

<u>Introduction:</u> Just as the vineyard is an image of God's care for the people, so too the image of a great banquet is special. It represents that day when God's promise will be a reality.

#### 1<sup>st</sup> **Reading:** Isaiah 25:6-10

We hear Isaiah describing how the Lord God will prepare a rich banquet. Like the covenant on the mountain, the mountain is the place where God will wipe away all tears and fulfil the people's hopes.

# **2<sup>nd</sup> Reading:** Philippians 4: 12-24, 19-20

We hear the conclusion of Paul's letter. He reflects on what his life has been and encourages the Church at Philippi that God will fulfil all their needs, before finishing with a Jewish form of blessing.

### **Gospel:** Matthew 22: 1-14 (Shorter form Mt 22: 1-10)

We hear a parable of Jesus addressed to the Jewish leaders. The story has several different scenes, before leading to a challenging conclusion that is still valid for us.

<u>Prayer of Intercession</u>: Saint Paul tells us; "My God will fully supply whatever you need, in accord with his glorious riches in Christ Jesus." It is in Jesus' name that we offer prayers of petition to God from whose fullness we long to receive.

1. We pray for the Church leaders, the Pope and our bishops. May they always proclaim the welcome of the kingdom is open to all.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

2. We pray for the Jewish leaders of modern Israel. May they remember the Hebrew scriptures' image of the banquet on the mountain, and be able to share that with all peoples and nations.

(**pause**) We pray to the Lord.

- 3. We pray for the people of our country that the image of the banquet remind us that we are all boat people who have come to share the riches of this land. May we not harden our hearts to the hopes and dreams of other to share at the banquet. **(pause)** We pray to the Lord. **Lord hear our prayer.**
- 4. We pray for families facing persecution, war and displacement. May we respond with generosity and compassion. (pause) We pray to the Lord. Lord hear our prayer.
- 5. We pray for those in our parish who are sick and in need of healing, especially those that are listed on our continuing prayer list. We pray for those who lovingly care for them. We pray for all those who have recently died, especially Beau John Skowron. We pray also for those whose anniversary occurs at this time.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

#### Lord hear our prayer.

6. For the purpose and mission of our parish: at this time may the Holy Spirit keep our eyes and ears open, so that nothing may blind or deafen us to the Lord's will for us nor take away our confidence in his call to be servants of the Gospel for our community.

(**Pause**) We pray to the Lord.

<u>Celebrant:</u> Lord our God, we believe that in you we shall want nothing, that only goodness and kindness will follow us all the days of our lives. Listen to us today, anoint us with hope and cast out all fear.

We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen

# A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew.

Whomsoever you find invite to the wedding.

Jesus said to the chief priests and elders of the people: 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a feast for his son's wedding. He sent his servants to call those who had been invited, but they would not come. Next he sent some more servants. "Tell those who have been invited" he said "that I have my banquet all prepared, my oxen and fattened cattle have been slaughtered, everything is ready. Come to the wedding." But they were not interested: one went off to his farm, another to his business, and the rest seized his servants, maltreated them and killed them. The king was furious. He dispatched his troops, destroyed those murderers and burnt their town. Then he said to his servants, "The wedding is ready; but as those who were invited proved to be unworthy, go to the crossroads in the town and invite everyone you can find to the wedding." So these servants went out onto the roads and collected together everyone they could find, bad and good alike; and the wedding hall was filled with guests. When the king came in to look at the guests he noticed one man who was not wearing a wedding garment, and said to him, "How did you get in here, my friend, without a wedding garment?" And the man was silent. Then the king said to the attendants, "Bind him hand and foot and throw him out into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth." For many are called, but few are chosen.'
