

REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate

Jesus first cleverly throws his questioners on the defensive. *They* are the ones carrying the coinage, not him. Then he poses the crucial question, 'Whose image is it and whose inscription?' They said to him, 'Caesar's'. Then he said to them: 'Render to Caesar what is Caesar's and to God what is God's.'

The coin bore the image and inscription of Caesar. Genesis teaches us that human beings are made in the image and likeness of God. Our Lord is saying, 'Let the political and financial authorities have their coinage. It is their legal tender. But they cannot have human beings. Human beings belong to Another. They belong to God.'

We are fortunate to live in a wonderful democracy. But even a democracy can violate the dignity of a human being created in the image and likeness of God. As Pope John Paul II said: 'Authentic democracy is possible only in a state ruled by law, *and on the basis of a correct conception of the human person*.' (Italics added)

We could pause for a moment to thank God for the inscription, 'Child of God', effectively engraved on our hearts by baptism.

St. Brigid's Parish – 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year A)

Introduction: Another famous scriptural image is the contrast to give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to give to God what belongs to God. Its original context was in a plot to trap Jesus, but he turns the tables with great skill.

1st Reading: Isaiah 45: 1, 4-6

We hear an unlikely story from Isaiah. It is really a history lesson when a foreign king, Cyrus of Persia, becomes the instrument of God in one of the greatest events in the history of salvation.

2nd Reading: 1 Thessalonians 1: 1-5

We begin a series of readings from the First letter to the Thessalonians, which could be the oldest book in the New Testament. We hear its beginning, and a prayer of thanksgiving for the faith of the people of Thessalonica.

Matthew 22: 15-21 Gospel:

We hear another of the traps that the Jewish authorities set to catch Jesus. His answer beats them at their own game about fine distinctions.

Prayer of Intercession:

Celebrant: With steadfast hope in our Lord Jesus Christ, let us pray to the Lord who calls us by name.

For the Church: may the Christian community humbly yet firmly lift up a prophetic voice on behalf of those who cannot speak for themselves

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

For those committed to the mission of the church in their own land or around the world: may they proclaim Christ with integrity in word and deed.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

For teachers: that teaching in the power of the Holy Spirit and with conviction, they may help students experience the Gospel as a message of grace and wisdom.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

For those called to defend peace: that balancing many needs and injustices, peace-keeping forces may subdue aggression and uphold the safety of all.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

For the peoples of Israel and Palestine and all who live in the fear of war: may they be held in God's care and be given the strength to endure times of suffering and hardship

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

- For our nation Australia: we continue to pray for our homeland as we all seek new paths for encounter and reconciliation with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples for our nation's common good.
- We pray for those in our parish who are sick and in need of healing, especially those that are listed on our continuing prayer list and for those who lovingly care for them, may the anointing of the Holy Spirit bestow upon them the healing and peace of Christ. For all those who have recently died and for those whose anniversary occurs at this time, especially Lynne Connors and Jack & Jean Wilson, that being called by name and grasped by God's hand, those we have loved but see no longer, may be welcomed into eternal life...

(**pause**) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

For a spirit of unity and of working together for our parish: that a fresh and deeper love and respect for the presence, prayer and work of everyone in our parish, will strengthen our unity and keep us working together for the common good.

Let us commend ourselves, and all for whom we pray, to the mercy and protection of God.

(**Pause**) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

Celebrant: Kind and loving God, you remember us always. Receive these prayers that come before you today, not in words alone, but in power and in the Spirit, and with much conviction. Grant us this in Jesus' name. Amen.

First Reading

Isaiah 45:1.4-6

A reading from the prophet Isaiah.

I have taken the hand of Cyrus to subdue nations before his countenance.

Thus says the Lord to his anointed, to Cyrus, whom he has taken by his right hand to subdue nations before him and strip the loins of kings, to force gateways before him that their gates be closed no more:

It is for the sake of my servant Jacob, of Israel my chosen one, that I have called you by your name, conferring a title though you do not know me. I am the Lord, unrivalled; there is no other God besides me.

Though you do not know me, I arm you

that men may know from the rising to the setting of the sun that, apart from me, all is nothing.

Tell us your opinion, then. Is it permissible to pay taxes to Caesar or not?' But Jesus was aware of their malice and replied, 'You hypocrites! Why do you set this trap for me? Let me see the money you pay the tax with.' They handed him a denarius, and he said, 'Whose head is this? Whose name?' 'Caesar's' they replied. He then said to them, 'Very well, give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar – and to God what belongs to God.'
