REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate

Did you notice that Our Lord does not command us to love 'God'? No, we are to love 'the Lord your God', the One who rescued the Jewish people from slavery. The resurrection of Jesus Christ reveals the Lord God as the liberator from the apparent final dominance of death. Loving such a liberator is the natural response. So, 'Love the Lord your God'.

Then Our Lord does not command us to love our neighbour! Rather, 'Love your neighbour as yourself.' But who is 'yourself'? In the wonderful story telling of Genesis, we are told that Adam, an earthen statue, had Divine Breath breathed into the nostrils, creating him as a human being.

We earthlings are conceived with the Divine Breath at the core of our being. The challenge for you and for me is to see 'yourself' in that way, and thereafter every human being whose lives we can affect: the neighbour. And in today's global world, the neighbour can be a person in a society geographically or culturally distant.

We could pause for a moment to see the true dimensions of God, self and the other, to more easily fulfil the dual command.

Introduction: The greatest commandment was another question used to trick Jesus by the Jewish leaders. The love of God and love of neighbour are the parallel tracks of the Christian way. Jesus illustrates that, when the question is put to him.

1st Reading: Exodus 22: 20-26

We hear from Exodus the context of laws and customs especially in treating others in need and being fair in all ways. This is portrayed as background to what Jesus says in the Gospel.

2nd Reading: 1 Thessalonians 1:5-10

We hear the continuation from last week when Paul again praises the Church of Thessalonica for their strength of faith, and their example to other churches.

Matthew 22:34-40 Gospel:

We hear another controversy used to express the growing opposition to Jesus. The lawyer's question is loaded to trap Jesus, but again he beats them at their own game, and his riposte is devastating.

Prayer of Intercession: Brothers and sisters, the Lord is our fortress and our strength, with confidence, therefore, let us bring our needs before the God who saves us.

- For the Church: that Christian communities may live the love of God and neighbour that we proclaim to others. (**pause**) We pray to the Lord. Lord hear our prayer.
- For leaders of nations: that they will make wise and humane provisions for those seeking refuge from poverty or oppression.

(**pause**) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

For all who live in the fear of war: may those who grieve be comforted, the injured consoled and healed, the Lord be close to those in fear and restrain those who turn to violence. May we seek the Lord's wisdom when we speak of justice, peace and security for all.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

4. For all the relationships in our lives – those we love and those we find hard to love: that we treat each other with gentleness, civility and loving concern.

(pause) We pray to the Lord

Lord hear our prayer.

For those undertaking final examinations: may they know the peace of God, the support of family and teachers, and approach with confidence this harvest time of their studies.

(**pause**) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

For all who ask our prayers in a time of sickness and pain - especially those on our parish prayer list and for all who care for them: may they hold fast to the Lord who is their strength. For all those who have died recently, especially *Sharon* Black and for those whose anniversary occurs at this time, especially Doris Brassell and Saverio Spano, may they know the glory of the resurrection and those who mourn be comforted.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

For the gifts of wisdom and courage for our parish: that the Holy Spirit will continue to pour into our hearts the precious gifts of wisdom and courage that will help us to empower our service for our community's life and witness..

Let us commend ourselves, and all for whom we pray, to the mercy and protection of God.

(**Pause**) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

Compassionate God, you are a refuge for the poor and helpless. Hear our prayers and place in our hearts the desire to live your commandment of love. We make these prayers through Christ our lord. Amen.

Exodus 22:20-26

Gospel Acclamation

A reading from the book of Exodus.

If you are harsh with the widow or the orphan, my anger will rage against you.

The Lord said to Moses, 'Tell the sons of Israel this, "You must not molest the stranger or oppress him, for you lived as strangers in the land of Egypt. You must not be harsh with the widow, or with the orphan; if you are harsh with them, they will surely cry out to me, and be sure I shall hear their cry; my anger will flare and I shall kill you with the sword, your own wives will be widows, your own children orphans.

"If you lend money to any of my people, to any poor man among you, you must not play the usurer with him: you must not demand interest from him.

"If you take another's cloak as a pledge, you must give it back to him before sunset. It is all the covering he has; it is the cloak he wraps his body in; what else would he sleep in? If he cries to me, I will listen, for I am full of pity."

Second Reading

1 Thessalonians 1:5-10

A reading from the first letter of St. Paul to the Thessalonians.

You turned away from idols to serve God and await his Son.

You observed the sort of life we lived when we were with you, which was for your instruction, and you were led to become imitators of us, and of the Lord; and it was with the joy of the Holy Spirit that you took to the gospel, in spite of the great opposition all round you. This has made you the great example to all believers in Macedonia and Achaia since it was from you that the word of the Lord started to spread – and not only throughout Macedonia and Achaia, for the news of your faith in God has spread everywhere. We do not need to tell other people about it: other people tell us how we started the work among you, how you broke with idolatry when you were converted to God and became servants of the real, living God; and how you are now waiting for Jesus, his Son, whom he raised from the dead, to come from heaven to save us from the retribution which is coming.

Gospel

Matthew 22:34-40

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew.

You shall love the Lord your God and your neighbour as yourself.

When the Pharisees heard that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees they got together and, to disconcert him, one of them put a question, 'Master, which is the greatest commandment of the law?' Jesus said, 'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second resembles it: you must love your neighbour as yourself. On these two commandments hang the whole Law, and the Prophets also.'
