REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate God's plan for human happiness is mostly frustrated by a good person burying his or her personality traits, what one might call one's talents, which is really to bury oneself and to become invisible. In the old language of my schoolboy catechism, we should be concerned not just with sins of commission, but with sins of omission – failure of courage, failure to take risks, failure to put everything on the line with the personality and the moment in time given to you and to me. As Shakespeare says in Julius Caesar: 'There is a tide in the affairs of men which, taken at the flood, leads on to fortune; omitted, all the voyage of their life is bound in stillness and in miseries.' The Divine Tide is flowing through human history. We should trust ourselves to that tide which can carry us to the shores of Heaven. Failure to take risks leads to Hellish stillness and miseries. We could pause for a moment to pray that we might use our talents so as to hear: 'Well done, good and faithful servant come and join in your Master's happiness.' <u>mtate@bigpond.com</u>

## <u>Brigid's Parish</u> – 33<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year A)

Introduction: As we approach the end of the Church's liturgical year we again face the theme about the need to be watchful and awake when Christ Jesus comes in Judgment.

## **1**<sup>st</sup> **Reading:** Proverbs 31:10-13, 19-20, 30-31

In this very poetic passage from Proverbs we read of the "perfect wife". This rhetorical question could well be phrased about the perfect Christian.

## 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading: 1 Thessalonians 5:1-6

We hear how Paul is forced to revise his teaching about the time of the second coming of Christ. Jesus will certainly come again, but no one knows the time.

### **Gospel:** Matthew 25:14-30

This parable of the talents is the challenge to accept the responsibility before God for our own actions. The issue is one of life style and how to make responsible and productive use of resources.

**Prayer of Intercession:** As faithful servants of the Gospel working until the Master's return, let us pray on behalf of the human family.

1. For the People of God: That the church may neither hide its gifts nor shrink from taking risks, but use wisely the talents the Master has entrusted to us.

(Pause) We pray to the Lord

2. For Francis, our Pope and Peter, our Bishop: that in their ministry they may be watchful, diligent and compassionate

(**Pause**) We pray to the Lord

For all who work in business and politics, science and technology: that they may bring gifts of skill and 3. compassion to their daily work Lord hear our prayer

(**Pause**) We pray to the Lord

4. For nations torn apart by war: acknowledging the seeds of conflict and division which reside in the human heart, we pray for comfort for the grieving, healing for the injured, resilience for the fearful and courage those who work for peace and justice. Lord hear our prayer

(Pause) We pray to the Lord

For ourselves and each other: that we, who know not the day nor the hour, may be attentive to every task 5. and opportunity the Lord sets before us, great or small.

(**Pause**) We pray to the Lord

For those who are sick – especially those on our parish prayer list - and all who care for them: we invoke 6. for them the strength, courage and healing of the Holy Spirit. For the faithful departed: especially for those who died recently, and for those whose anniversaries occur at this time, especially Pauline Hartley, Trevor Hannan and Pat Haire. May we not grieve as those who do not have hope, but let our faith in the Risen Lord shine on our mourning.

**Celebrant:** Generous God, you lavish us with gifts so that we may work for the coming of your reign. Hear these prayers and help us to remain faithful to your word. We make this prayer through Christ our Lord.
