### **REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate**

Our Lord portrays himself as the Master who goes away on a journey. It is certain that he will return, even if no-one in his household knows exactly when. That is our situation. What do we do in anticipation?

Our Lord, the Master, indicates we have a choice. We can close our eyes and enter into the world of dreams where we create our own fantasy futures, or we can stay awake and alert to do what Our Lord wants us to do: 'He left his servants in charge, giving to each his work.'

You and me – his servants – have a particular role or work in and for this phase of human history. A deep down intuition, prompted by the Holy Spirit, indicates what this is. We must be true to this assignment.

We could take a moment to pray that, when the Lord returns, we may hear: 'Come, good and faithful servant, inherit the Kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world.'

## **Brigid's Parish** – First Sunday of Advent (Year B)

<u>Introduction</u>: In the liturgy of Advent we especially draw attention to how God has been revealed in Christ, is revealed in this Mass now, and will come again in glory. We pray that we may prepare well for His coming among us.

<u>Lighting of Advent Candle</u> Response: "Come Lord Jesus"

**1**st **Reading:** Isaiah 63:16-17, 64:3-8

In this special form of the Jewish blessing prayer, we recall God's blessing to us in the past. We ask God to continue to fulfil his promise.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Reading:** 1 Corinthians 1:3-9

We hear St. Paul's prayer of thanksgiving for the faith lived by his community. He prays for them to continue to be strong.

**Gospel:** Mark 13:33-37

We hear another of the predictions of Jesus to be ready for when he comes. May we be ever alert for his presence among us.

<u>Prayer of Intercession</u>: "God is faithful", St. Paul reminds us. Trusting in that fidelity, we pray for new life, hope, healing, and peace to those who call upon the name of God.

1. We pray for the Pope and the Bishops of the Church, that their call to all of goodwill to enter into the spirit of the season may be heard.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

2. We pray during the continuing crisis across the Holy Land, that dialogue will replace weapons, healing overcome injuries, comfort ease distress, reunions give hope to hostages and prisoners, and prayer bring peace to all.

5. We pray for our local community, that we here truly enter into the spirit of the season of Advent and live in response to the presence of Christ with us.

6. We pray for all who live with disabilities on this International Day of Persons with Disabilities, that their lives will be filled with respect, be free of discrimination, have access to all the support they need and the opportunities to develop their skills..

# A reading from the prophet Isaiah.
